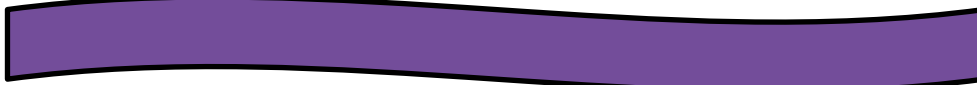


### October 18 - Fort Vancouver Lions at SHARE Soups On Celebrity Chef Fundraiser

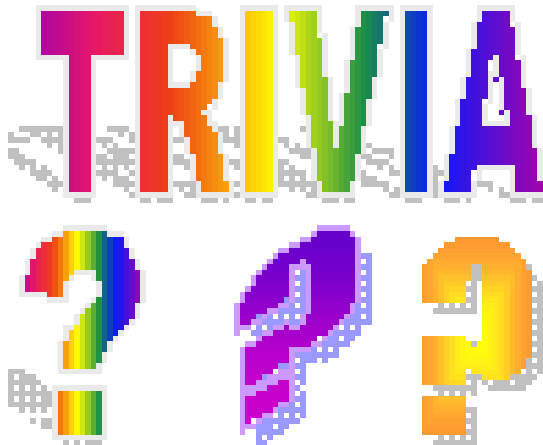
