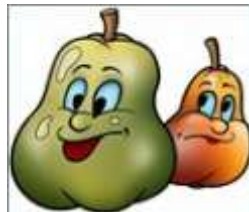
## It's Apple and Pear Time!

I know you all know just about everything you need to know about the Lion For Life and Strive For Five programs, because every Club in 19G-2 has signed up!

For the benefit of our new club leaders who have never heard of this thing, Lions For Life is a program that provides a structure for mentoring new Lions. Why do new Lions need mentoring? Glad you asked: New Lions need mentoring because new Lions drop out of Lions clubs at an alarming rate. New Lions drop out of Lions clubs because they: (1) Are unaware of the goals of their club; (2) Are not aware of the goals of Lions, and; (3) Do not feel like they "belong". All three of these reasons new Lions drop can be eliminated with a structured, well designed mentoring program.

And, that is where Lions For Life comes in. Lions For Life provides a structure so that your club can make mentoring new Lions fun and easy. It is a proven way to help clubs retain new Lions.

New Lions who go through the Lions For Life program are recognized by a gold. And, they tend to stick with their clubs, which is a good thing— why go to the effort of bringing in a new member if you don't want to keep them?

Strive For Five is a corollary to Lions For Life. Under the Strive For Five program, any club that brings in 5 new members in a year receives a special patch for their club banner to recognize the achievement. And, any member who manages to sponsor 2 or more new Lions in a year receives a special token.

So you may ask, What do you do now?

The answer is: Not much, but what you do means a whole lot. All your club has to do now that you are registered is bring in new members and then mentor them. The first task is on you. The second you can find lots of help with through the Club Support Team (see, page 5). Once the new member completes the program, you send in \$4.<sup>00</sup> for the Lions For Life pin to remind your now mentored recruit that he or she really is a Lion For Life.. That's it. Everything else is done for you.

Hey! We can do this. So let's go earn those patches and pins!

The season at the Sleep Country Amphitheater has come to an end. I would like to thank each and every one of you that helped us this year. We worked 12 concerts. That included 5 Clark County Fair concerts in 7 days. Our workforce included identification checkers, wrist banders, and alcohol monitors. We also worked beer kiosks at several of the shows. The smaller concerts had 13 to 15 workers and the larger shows over 30.

We could not have worked these concerts without the help of many. Lions from our club and others worked every concert. But it was the help from friends of our club **that made this year a success. We couldn't have done this without them. Most of the** events had many more non Lion workers than members from our club. They not only worked every show but often were the ones that stayed late with our club members, not leaving until after 10 PM.

We worked 1151 total hours and earned \$7551.80 wrist banding. That will go into **our and other Lion club's coffers and will help a lot of the less fortunate in our area,** and charities that we support. This down a little bit from last year but is still one of our largest fundraisers. This was our 8<sup>th</sup> year working at the amphitheater and we have earned nearly \$80,000.00

We have informed the amphitheater that this was probably our last year to work out there at the wrist banding job. The rules that are now strictly enforced have become too burdensome. We told them that we may still man beer kiosks, and will be available to help from time to time, but we will not sign the contract they way it is presently written. That means that we must come up with some new fundraisers to replace these dollars. Many charitable groups and Clark county citizens rely on us for help. If you know of other ways to earn money please let us know.

I would also like to thank Steve Staudinger for all of his hard work as the assistant manager. Steve handled the management duties on one side of the venue at every show. Thank you Steve for all you did every year out there.

Thanks again everyone for making this season such a success.
