It's Strawberry Time! 28th Annual Fort Vancouver Lions Fresh Strawberry Sales Kicks Off in May





Fort Vancouver Lions Board Meeting March 17, 2016 Minutes

The meeting was called to order by president, Craig Limoges at 6:03 PM. A quorum was established. Members present were Craig Limoges, Doug Wilson, Gay Enyeart, Tony Licata, Sandy Hammond, Wanda Slevin, and Carol Cooper. Guests: Dee Dee Miller, Terry Sutfin, Helen Sutfin.

Correspondence: Doug noted requests from Habitat for Humanity and Leaderdogs for the Blind. The NW Association for Blind Athletes Annual Report was also received.

Minutes: The minutes from March 3 were approved unanimously.

Treasurers Report: Gay reported on the profit/loss, balance sheet, etc. for the Club's Administrative and Foundation Accounts. Craig requested a year to date sheet for next meeting to see where we are on budgeted versus actual expenditures. Gay noted that she had paid for our magazine subscription for Lions magazine to the Fort Vancouver Regional Library. It costs \$6 and she noted that it was money well spent to spread the word of Lionism at the Library. There was general assent from the board.

Vice Presidents Reports:

1st Vice President. No report. Craig noted that White Cane is coming up. Gay noted that she had spoken with Chucks and reserved both doors for the White Cane day. Carol noted that she had submitted a request for the Hazel Dell, Orchards, and Chakalov Fred Meyers. They would also request Burgerville.

2nd Vice President. Tony noted that the track meet was coming up and he would chat with Roy regarding when that was occurring. Bioblitz is also coming up.

Membership. No report, but Craig reported that there was an application and dues for Dixie Hotaling, Sponsored by Jerry Jacobus. Craig noted that Dixie had become active with the club under the Flags for First Graders project and had volunteered on a number of other club activities. Sandy made a motion to accept Dixie as a member in the club. It was seconded by Carol and the motion was passed unanimously. Doug agreed to send a note to Roy to alert the membership to welcome Dixie to the club. Congratulations and Welcome to Dixie!

Administration/Past President. Sandy reported on the April 28 evening meeting and induction for new members. She noted a number of venues she had looked into. Terry noted that NorthCrest Church may have a room that would work at a good rate. Sandy will look into it. Craig will secure an officer to induct the new members. Doug will order at least four new member packets from LCI. Doug will confirm the new members that have not been inducted.

Old Business:

1. Doug updated the group on the Bioblitz project. He reiterated that possible service activities include orientation to Visitors, manning the first aid and lost and found booth, and running a Lions Centennial Booth.

2. WinCo Golf Tournament Fundraiser. Craig reported that he and Dee Dee and Al Rhyason had met with the Golf Pro at Club Green Meadows and had gotten some good ideas for promoting the fundraiser. Dee Dee will contact High Schools who have golf teams and is asking Golf Pros to ask members to sign up. Doug reported that on behalf of Steve S. he had requested a table for the club specifically for this fundraiser for the 19G conference.

3. Craig reported on the new member orientation. With the assistance of Martha, three dates were chosen and nine new members (including one from the Salmon Creek Club) were oriented.

4. Spring Conference and Awards. There was a discussion on conference and awards for the Spring Conference. Sandy wondered who would do the musical comedy routine this year as it would be hard for anyone to live up to her and Doug's performance last year. Possible club contests included the uniform contest. There was general consensus to spread the word for members to enter the contests!

New Business:

1. Terry Sutfin requested that the Club support the Spring District 19G Conference by authorizing an account under our EIN to support registration and expenses and to keep it open for two years as Terry would be chairing the registration for this meeting and one in two years. DG JD Nellor, Conference Chair John Donnelly, and Terry would be signatories. Wanda made the motion to: Permit Terry Sutfin to open a Fort Vancouver Lions 19G Conference Account for the purpose of the District 19G Spring Conference. Carol seconded. There was some discussion that District 19G did not have a regular checking account and no account except an escrow account. After discussion, the motion carried four to one with one abstention. Doug agreed to draft a letter and prepare the minutes for Terry to use to help set up the account.

2. Craig noted that there was a request by Hal Palmer for the club to support his candidacy for International Director. There was some discussion regarding this request including whether this is typical of someone running for International Director, the likelihood of Hal winning, the great honor that would come to our District if Hal won. Sandy made a motion to contribute \$100 from the Club Administration fund to support Hal Palmer's candidacy for International Director in Japan. Wanda seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:07 PM. The next board meeting will be on Thursday April 7, 2016, 6:00 PM at the H.H. Hall Building.
