#### Fort Vancouver Lions Board Meeting January 8, 2015

The meeting was called to order by President Sandy Hammond. A quorum was declared. Members present were Sandy Hammond, Craig Limoges, Helen Sutfin, Terry Sutfin, Carol Bisbee, Len Leger Diana Olds, and Catrina Galicz, and Adam Hegewald.

**Secretary Carol Bisbee:** The minutes were approved as distributed. Correspondence included newsletters from several organizations that will be available at the January 9<sup>th</sup> meeting. We also received two contributions.

**Treasurer Terry Sutfin:** distributed two profit and loss statements. One statement was for the month of December and one for October 15<sup>th</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>. A full report will be presented at the January 22<sup>nd</sup> Board Meeting.

**President Sandy Hammond:** Courtyard Village: Len Leger reported \$282.00 was presented to the Council for the Homeless, designated to aid families from Washington Elementary who had received eviction notices. Len moved that we donate an additional \$300.00, which would come from our Foundation Account. The motion was seconded by Diana Olds and unanimously approved.

**Newsletter**: Shelly Brown noted that she has not been receiving information in a timely manner so our newsletters have been late getting published and distributed. Following discussion the decision was made to direct Shelly to go ahead and publish whatever information she had received by the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month. Therefore the newsletter can be sent out by the first of the month.

**Club Excellence Award:** Sandy reported that she had met with Carol to discuss what our club needs to do to receive this award. This will be discussed in greater detail at the Executive Board Meeting on January 15<sup>th</sup>, with a report presented to the full board on January 22<sup>nd</sup>. Lions Leaders Forum will be March 7<sup>th</sup> 2015. This is for all Lions not just new people and officers. We have been asked if

A motion was made by Helen that we sponsor the afternoon coffee break and should limit our cost to \$150.00 or less. The motion was seconded. There were 8 yes votes and 1 no vote. Motion carried.

1<sup>st</sup> Vice President Craig Limoges-Club Administration: Craig reported that the constitution and by-laws were almost complete and would be ready to present to the Executive Board on January 15, 2015.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Roy Pulliam-Fund-Raising:** Roy was not present. Len reminded us of the benefit concert on March 6<sup>th</sup>. He also gave a report from the social committee. The Christmas Party was very well attended. With the auction items we were able to cover all our expenses. Jen Leger won the 50/50 raffle drawing. The next social outing will be the Winterhawks game on January 28<sup>th</sup>.

**3rd Vice President Helen Sutfin-Service Projects:** The Santa Store went very well. There were enough gifts. Set up and take down went very well. All remaining are sorted and boxed. After Christmas shopping has not been done as the committee has not been able to coordinate a time. Multiple projects were completed including Bell Ringing for the Salvation Army and the Share House. Over 500 hours of service was reported to LCI for December. The next events for Washington Elementary will be Reading to first graders, and at the end of the year Play Day. National Lions Service Day is this month. Helen will pass around a clipboard at the meeting Friday listing opportunities to serve. We are still planning something for the First Responders.

**New Business:** Helen Sutfin reported that new eye glass collection boxes are coming and should be here January  $20^{th}$ . They are being sent from LERC. Pens have been ordered. Helen suggested we create a manual listing where all our various supplies are ordered. This would simplify ordering.

Terry reported 23 members have not paid their dues. The first 6 months payment was made and included these individuals. Members will attempt to contact these individuals to determine if they are going to pay their dues and continue as Lions, or if they wish to be dropped. These will be presented again at the next board meeting before dues have to be remitted.

**Open Forum:** 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration. This will take place April 1<sup>st</sup>. Jim Moffit will help design the pin for the Century Awards, which will be given to individuals whose combined age and years of service equal 100 or more. The cost would be approximately \$200.00 for 100 pins. A second pin was discussed to be used as our 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary pin. Len moved that \$400.00 be designated for the two pins. The motion was seconded by Adam, and unanimously approved. Len will ask Jim to help design the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary pin as well. A question was raised about the policy on reimbursements. Once receipts have been submitted they must be paid within thirty days. The suggestion was made to add that receipts should also have to be submitted within 30 days of the expenditure. No vote was taken on the matter. Adam asked that we do a 6 months review of how we are doing with Fund Raising and Expenses to see if we are on target for the year. This will be addressed at a future board meeting.

**Leos Report:** Helen reported that there are 9 active Leos and that they have been very busy. They have visited at the Share House three times handing out hygiene kits. They also helped with the Bell Ringing for the Salvation Army and have assisted the Vancouver Lions Clubs with several projects.

An executive board meeting will be held next week. Sandy will e-mail date and time. The next full board meeting will be January 22<sup>nd</sup>. The Zone meeting will be January 20<sup>th</sup> at WSSB at 6:30 pm. The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 pm.
