We will meet somewhere east and carpool. Plan on meeting at around 9:30 AM. That will get us to the trailhead shortly after 10. We will take our time and end at the waterfall around lunch time. So bring a sack lunch and something to drink. We will put our meal in a backpack. We should be back at the trailhead early afternoon.

### Hike Description

The lower trail begins along the south side of the creek in a young forest of Douglas-fir. About 100 yards from the trailhead, bear right at the junction marked for Falls Creek Falls; the left hand trail marked for the horse camp will be your return route on the loop. The first half mile of the hike has several points where you and the kids can scramble down to the creek bed. Smooth rocks and several small pools invite wading, but the water remains icy cold through the summer. After another half mile, the path rises above the creekbed and the gentle stream is funneled through a small carved basalt canyon, which roars in the spring. Cross to the north side of the creek on a [suspension bridge](#) above the narrow chasm and you will get a good look at how the water has carved its way through the basalt.

After the suspension bridge, the forest is more mature with plenty of snags and old growth giants of cedar and fir. Hike another mile upstream and go past the [signed connector trail](#) to the Upper Falls Creek Trail. Cross another footbridge and round a large bend in the trail and you will start to hear the roar of [Falls Creek Falls](#). The trail will take you right up to a front row view of the thundering waters. Large boulders scattered around the viewing area provide good seats and picnic tables.

Falls Creek Falls is accessed from the Wind River Highway north of Carson. Approximately 16 miles north of Carson or 10 miles south of Oldman Pass, turn east onto FSR 3062, which is signed for Falls Creek. After 2 miles the road splits - turn right onto road 3062-057 and follow signs to the Lower Falls Creek Trailhead in another ¾ mile.

## Fort Vancouver Lions Board Meeting Minutes May 1, 2014

Present: President Adam Hegewald, Sandy Hammond, Roy Pulliam, Lee Denny, Ralph Harding, Steve Staudinger, Bill Shalaby, John Caldwell, Charissa Steinman, Bruce Preece and Martha Johnson.

Quorum present.

Ralph moved to approve the minutes for April 3. Steve Staudinger asked to add that he had presented balance sheets and income statements. Minutes approved with correction.

**Correspondence:** None

**Treasurers Report:** Steve presented the balances for the Club and the Foundation. He discussed the upcoming expenses. The money spent on Melvin Jones Awards each year was discussed. The Melvin Jones Committee will make a recommendation to the Board. Steve feels it is not in our best interest to present one this year. A LCI store receipt was presented to Steve and it was determined that the treasurer will pay it. Steve will be given a login and password to access this account. We have several items budgeted to cover yet this year: White Cane Day, NW Lions Foundation, etc.

The next Board Meeting will be May 15 at the Credit Union meeting room. It is the same day as the WSSB Track Meet.

**Old/New Business:**

Meetings for the rest of May have been worked out. The 5<sup>th</sup> Friday (or Thursday night) is still unresolved. We can try to do some outdoor meetings like at a park or something. Rainy weather is always a factor in May. Adam can reserve Frenchman's Bar for \$50, but if we don't use it we lose it. Sandy suggested we go to the American Legion. Adam will check on it and confirm it. Roy will get a program for it.

Julie at American Legion said there is a church group that would possibly be willing to share expenses on a storage container outside the American Legion. This might be a possibility if we cancelled our use of the storage unit in which we stored Santa Store items previously.

The Elks have offered the use of another room for lunch, but it would cost \$150. It does have advantages but we would have to charge more for lunches. The Elks Lodge seating arrangement would need to be changed if we continue to meet there. There was discussion regarding the service, cost and food at the American Legion facility.

Adam asked for a show of hands of those in favor of meeting at the American Legion. Following discussion it was decided that there are pros and cons for each facility.

Lions Officer Installation Meeting: Adam is considering the American Legion – buffet format. Will there be a stipend to supplement the cost of the meal for each person? Combine awards banquet with Installation Banquet. Adam will notify members that he will cancel the day meeting on June 13 and have the Installation Banquet that evening. Budgeted for that Installation Banquet is: \$200 approximately. Carol Bisbee was Rookie of the Year last year and she needs to turn in the plaque for inscription.

**Recommended Club purchases:**

If we stay at Elks there is open storage we need to have a locked storage unit. Adam requested \$160 to purchase a storage unit. No action.

Adam requested that the Club purchase a wireless Bluetooth microphone to mate with the new PA system (from Costco @ \$23.95) Roy moved to approve this purchase, it was seconded and passed unanimously.

It was a consensus of the Board to purchase a Lions Purple Banner to hold club awards (\$200)

Adam requested the Board approve \$25 purchase of Lion Tail Twister Happy Bucks Cup. No action.

Ruth Anne Barnard membership was approved in April; Walt Miller will be dropped off roster in June and a memorial donation will be made to the Clark County Sight Foundation and Clark County Hearing Foundations (\$125 to each.)

Charity of the Month Donations: \$400 has been spent so far – of a budgeted \$600.

Social Committee Update: The Kentucky Derby Party will be held at the Pulliam household on May 3<sup>rd</sup> from 2 – 5. A hike to Falls Creek is being planned for June. Bowling will be in June or July.

**2<sup>nd</sup> VP Report**

Bill Shalaby reported Gay Enyeart is prepared to receive and track the orders, the printing is completed, the tri-fold party will be held on the May 6 at Al Rhyasen’s.

**3<sup>rd</sup> VP Report**

Martha Johnson reported that all stations are manned and all locations are approved for White Cane Day.

Bruce Preece reported the tree planting at Washington Elementary was a success. 45 trees were donated by the Clark County PUD. There was no expense to the Club.

Roy Pulliam reported that the May 15 WSSB Track Meet needs volunteers. Planning is on schedule. The Pickle Ball people will be there to volunteer again this year.

It is set up for us to participate in the Fred Meyer fundraiser service project.
