Minutes of Previous meeting: Approved as corrected

Correspondence: Flyers were received from Leader Dogs and the Share House.

- Adam requested a thank you note be sent to DG Steve Patterson for his visit to our club. It was moved by Dotty Scott that we include a \$50.00 check with the thank you for him to use for gas money, or for whatever his need is. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved. Treasurers Report: Hallie distributed print-outs for the Club and Administrative accounts. Both were approved as distributed. One note of explanation was the storage unit. This was obtained to house the gifts for the Santa Store. The cost will be deducted from the expenses for the Santa Store.

In response to a question regarding change over time, Ralph reported that in December of 2012, our Savings and Investment Funds were \$63,351. (Secretary Note: The number of people served was an all-time high during the first half of this year.)

Old business: In regard to the distribution of surplus Northwest Lions Sight Foundation equipment, no local Lions organizations had responded to Bill Lundin that they were prepared to use the equipment. Bill also had contacted Longview Pioneer club since they are a part of the Foundation similar to ours, but no decision back to Bill from Pioneer. Meetings that Bill attends will make a decision on surplus equipment in near future.

Scanners: Wide ranging discussion on the need to get rid or need to physically store past applications by using technological options. It is desirable to have a copy of the entire application, rather than name, date of service, and service provided. On the forms there are many times, notes from client, and patient care coordinator that could be meaningful in making decisions about subsequent services.

Some consensus that a scanner that can do two sides of a page plus have a program for handling information. Estimated cost of storage \$100 per year.

Jeff plans to contact Lion Stacy Walters for technological advise on this matter.

David Page is scheduled to attend December meeting to consult on Web Site.

We need to be prepared to give Mr. Page 3 or 4 options for a Domain Name for our web site. Lions Sight Foundation of Clark County LSFCC seem to be first option.

In response to a question, Treasurer Vicki stated that we are prepared and equipped to send our end of the year statements acknowledging donations to a 501 3C organization.

Ralph reported that reservations have been made for our Banquet and Auction has been made at Club Green Meadows for April 12, 2014

Question from Bill L. regarding and idea that was presented a few years ago, by KEX Needy Kids Fund that Skamania, Cowlitz, and Wahkiakum kids applications be processed by Lions Sight Foundation of Clark County for referral to KEX. The KEX Fund was short of funds and was not providing service for a period of time. No one

attending the meeting has a solid handle on current status.
