

We had 9 performers and 3 Gonged acts. The Grand Prize winner this year was Dewald VonDeavanta from South Africa. He is a student at the School of Piano Technology for the Blind. He played the piano and the crowd loved it. Second place was local musician Jeremy Roberson. He played the guitar and sang a song that he wrote. Receiving \$25 gift cards from Beaches were: Guitar player and singer Tony Licata, singer Craig Limoges, Comedian Dave McCormack, and guitar players and singers Don Mitchell and Bill Reed. The best gonged act was by husband and wife, Doug Wilson and Tracy Formann. They rode in on stick ponies as Roy Rogers and Dale Evans and lead the crowd in the singing of Happy Trails to you. John Caldwell played an upbeat tune on the piano. Bruce Preece dressed as a baker. He told us the story of the death of the Pillsbury Dough Boy. Marilyn Robertson dressed in a red, white and blue outfit, led the crowd in singing of America the Beautiful. Marci Wilson the daughter of Doug and Tracy played the piano for us.

Our Corporate Sponsor for this benefit concert was Limoges Investment Management. Craig donated \$2000.
