It is a very productive day of Lionism and Leadership experience. Please join us!

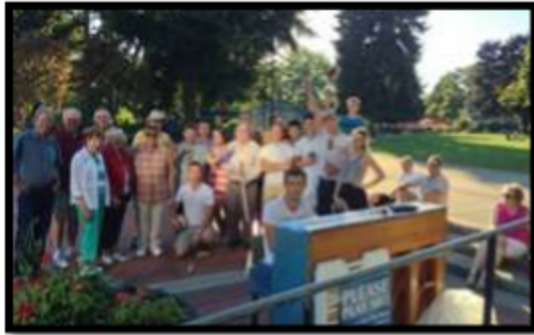

September 5, 2013**

The meeting was called to order by President Adam Hegewald at 6:00 pm. A quorum was present. Present: Adam H., Sandy H., Hallie W., Patricia G., Helen S., Dotty S., Ralph H., Bruce P., Len L., Roy P., Carol B., and Bill S.

Minutes for the August Board Meeting: It was moved, seconded, and voted unanimously that the minutes be approved as distributed.

Correspondence: Adam presented a letter of confirmation from LCIF. We are eligible for two individuals to be awarded Melvin Jones Fellowships. MD19 has changed the way visitations are recorded this year. A separate sheet must be sent directly to MD 19 by the end of each month. There is no longer a VAD form to submit visitations on. We also received vouchers for voting at the Fall Convention. Any individuals attending the conference should notify Carol or Adam about receiving a voucher.

Treasurer's Report: Hallie distributed hand outs with all the information on both the Administration and Foundation accounts. It was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved that the treasurer's report be accepted as presented.

Old/New Business: Retreat: Having a retreat is a requirement for us to participate in the Club Excellence program. Dates and places were discussed for our retreat. Amy Hegewald, sponsored by Adam H., Tom Moorman sponsored by Steve S., Eva Halter, sponsored by Gay E., and Herb Schwartz, sponsored by Len L. All four applications were unanimously approved. It was also approved Mojgan Kasraei be dropped as she will no longer be in the area.

Christmas Party: Len reported the Christmas Party Committee had checked several locations, prices, etc. The best option was the Quay. The cost would be \$25.00 per person. The available date is December 13th. The Christmas ships will also be parading that evening. The time would be from 5-9 pm. An e-mail vote was recommended. We will need to make a deposit to reserve the date.

Convention Delegates: The Fall Seminar will be October 3-5th. Delegate voting vouchers have arrived. If anyone is attending the conference they will need to obtain one from Carol Bisbee in order to be eligible to vote.

MD 19 Club Visitation Program: There are new requirements to complete to be eligible for a Club Excellence award for Visitations. A separate sheet must be submitted to MD19 each month.
