## 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Fort Vancouver Lions Strawberry Sale!

On Saturday June 23, twenty five club members and guests pitched in to bring the 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Fort Vancouver Lions Club Strawberry Sale project to a successful conclusion. Several factors presented challenges for the teams. First, the weather! There was heavy rain for most of the morning but Lions and customers all kept a positive attitude. Next, we had decided to limit the pick-up time to one hour which created long lines and traffic backups at several locations. Finally, there was an increase in sales volume. The result was more berries to deliver which overloaded our usual distribution system and cause Lions Lee Denny to rush from location to location, in a van borrowed from Dotty Scott (Thanks Dotty!). Despite these hurdles, the project wrapped up by noon with over 500 happy customers and over \$23,000 gross revenues. We still have to clear our expenses but project co-chairs Lee Denny and Len Leger are projecting over \$9,000 in net profit to support the club's charitable projects. 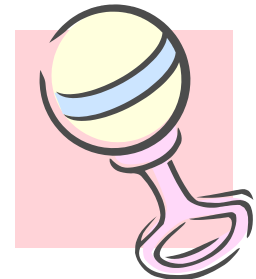
