## Proud to be a Lion by Ken Serviss

In mid November of 1972, my brother 1st Lieutenant George Serviss, was my guest at a club meeting. When George came downstairs to go with me, he had on civilian clothes. I asked him why he didn't wear his uniform. He answered, "It's better this way."

Naturally, he received the usual Ft. Vancouver welcome. After the meeting, he commented, "I didn't know anyone saluted the flag anymore, let alone sing the National Anthem."

Sadly, George was killed a month later on his way back to camp. He had volunteered to spend Christmas Day with a family who lost their son in combat.

To this day, I am proud of our club for what my brother saw when he visited. Vietnam veterans quite often received a lousy welcome when returning home, but not at the Ft. Vancouver Lions!

## NORTHWEST LIONS FOUNDATION UPDATE FOR September

I am pleased to report that this last year, we screened over 26,000 children and adults in our Lions Health Screening unit. On average, we refer about 14% of those screened on to professional caregivers, to correct their sight or hearing problems. Over 400 people were identified by local Lions Clubs and were sponsored in our Patient Care or Hearing Aid Bank programs. Although our Hearing Aid Bank got overwhelmed in mid-year with demand, we were able to eliminate the waiting list early this summer.

Our Project Support Grants managed to continue to support many Sight and Hearing programs throughout the State in the amount of \$50,000. This was far less than previous years, due to a short-fall in White Cane Days funding.

White Cane Days is the primary funding source for community programs.

Over the last ten years, SightLife has doubled the number of local and domestic corneal transplants to well over 5,000 per year. Last year, SightLife was responsible for giving over 10,800 people worldwide the gift of sight, and established more than eight free standing and sustainable eye banks in developing countries. SightLife was just named the winner of the 2012 Global Health Leader Award. This should make any Lions member proud.

## 2012 District 19's Fall Convention

Over 450 Lions, Lioness, and guests attended the Fall Convention in Nanaimo, Canada on October 11<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup>. Lions came from Idaho, Washington and British Columbia.
