Merry Christmas Fort Vancouver Lions!

I am very pleased to report a successful November. Lions Dotty Scott, as acting program chair for November, invited some interesting speakers. Our luncheon meeting summaries:

November 1st Debbie Hamm spoke about supporting early learning & families. Her son was afflicted with Batten Disease which brought service directed towards children and their development. She informed us of the needs of Clark County children and their development issues. Her main message...put your heart into teaching young children before they are 8 years old. This is the time they are most susceptible to learning and developing character that will guide them the rest of their lives.

November 8th - Ruthie Gohl The Battleground Free Clinic is a new facility serving North Clark County residents. It has been open 29 months, serving 353 patients for chronic & acute care needs. Vancouver residents are welcome. They turn away no person in need. Our board donated \$100 to that organization. We commend them for an outstanding effort and being a new resource for greater public health care solutions.

November 15th - Jerry Fest DePaul Youth for Family Center has a focus on the treatment of youth in the criminal justice system. It has treatment for children in grades 7-12. It is a 2 month program to get students through their personal issues, to learn coping skills, and to grasp the concept of completing their education. They are in need of key funds to extend their tutelage to extend the length of living skills training.

November 22th - Michele Holen Realtor's Foundation of Clark County and their new Habitat for Humanity Project features a web site, developed by Dotty Scott, that tells a story of a virtual family, waiting for their project to complete its financial needs in order to start the build. A great marketing tool which will generate more corporate donations to meet their goal faster.

November 9th at Club Green Meadows—Fort Vancouver Lions club awarded Lion Sandy Hammond and Adam Hegewald each a Melvin Jones Fellow award for their past service.
