



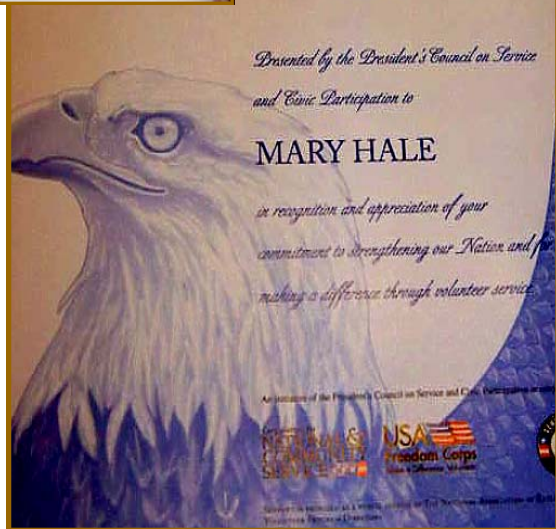

July was a very busy month for fund raising with the amphitheater concerts chaired by Roy Pulliam demanding a huge increase in our numbers of workers. At the board meeting this month Roy indicated: on one concert he had 25 of the 55 workers needed on the Monday of the concert. By Wednesday he had his quota of 55! This



could not have happened if as Lion's, we support these projects and have our family and friends added to his email list of amphitheater workers. [The majority of workers at a typical concert are non Lion's, who not only raise money for our club but are exposed to Lionism in a very positive manner.]

The beer kiosk under the direction of Dave and Susie Rawson is brand new this year and continues to be a fun place to work. If you haven't heard

Susie yell "Haaza.. To the tipper!" you need to sign up just to experience that, The amphitheater's budget this year was for \$8000 for wrist banding and \$3000 for the beer kiosk. We are well on our way to smashing this amount with two concerts left is September. September 20th will be Counting Crows, Maroon 5 and Augustana followed on the 21st by Journey, Cheap Trick and Heart.

On August the 13th we are providing service for the City of Vancouver by helping out at their employee picnic. Thanks to Helen Sutfin for organizing this event for us.

Ralph Harding has agreed to Chair our Apple/Pear project and has already made a trip to Hood River and met with the or-



chard that will be supplying the fruit.

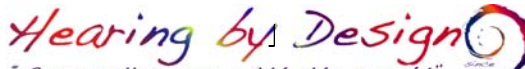

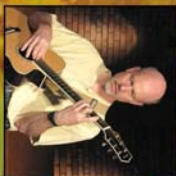
