

Fort Vancouver Lions Board Meeting March 3, 2016 Minutes

The meeting was called to order by president, Craig Limoges at 6:07 PM. A quorum was established. Members present were Craig Limoges, Doug Wilson, Tony Licata, Wanda Slevin, Martha Johnson, and Steve Staudinger.

Correspondence: A thank you letter from LCI for the Measles Campaign was noted for our \$1000 donation (which also supports a Melvin Jones Fellowship and was matched) and a request for donation from Habitat for Humanity.

Minutes: The minutes from February 18 were approved unanimously.

Treasurers Report: Gay on leave. Steve will fill in. No report.

Vice Presidents Reports:

1st Vice President. No report. Craig will ask fruit committee for an update.

2nd Vice President. Tony reported on the upcoming Washington Elementary Reading for Kindergarteners project. He had six volunteers. He will ask for more volunteers at the March 4 club meeting. Martha and Wanda also volunteered to participate. Tony updated the board on his meeting with the Principal. He noted that she needed donations to the principal's fund which is a discretionary account that is used for children's needs, like replacement eyeglasses. After some discussion, Tony will determine if the fund is administered by the Foundation and how best for the club to donate.

Administration/Past President. No report. It was noted, however, that Catrina's mother had passed away. Martha will let Eva know so the club can send a sympathy card. Also, Craig reported that he planned to hold a training for new members with some alternative dates. He indicated that he will announce it tomorrow at the club meeting and Martha will email it out to the new or recent members who did not have training yet.

There was a discussion on who would be likely to serve next year and the timing for nominations for officers. It was noted that the 2-year directors go to 1-year directors. There was a discussion of the need for people to volunteer for the positions. Craig reported that Sandy is working on the April 28 membership meeting.

Old Business:

- 1. Doug updated the group on the Bioblitz project. He agreed to send a blurb and possible volunteer activities for the event to Tony and Tony will assemble a team. Possible service activities include orientation to Visitors, manning the first aid and lost and found booth, or running a Lions Centennial Booth.
- 2. There was a brief discussion of the Jan Vanderspek memorial. It is believed that the checks were sent out by Gay prior to her vacation.
- 3. Craig reported briefly on the Lions Learning Forum on Saturday, 3/5/16. Club participants are each going to provide about 12 breakfast items, like donuts, muffins, fruit, or other food items.
- 4. Craig briefly went over the three month schedule draft, added a few events. There was a discussion over whether there would be a meeting on Memorial Day weekend on Friday May 27. It was agreed that we typically held this meeting.
- 5. Craig reported that he planned to meet with the golfers in the club about promoting the Winco Foods Portland Open fundraiser. Tony will assist as appropriate using social media and the web site including Facebook, email, etc. There was a brief discussion of the website and the need to dress up our link page to the fundraiser or to see if Winco could add our logo and other materials to its donation page set up for our club. Tony will review the page and Craig will provide the Winco marketing materials to Tony.
- 6. Craig gave an update on the MD-19G conference. Doug noted that he was meeting with John Donnelly on Friday after the club meeting regarding the Saturday Evening dance. Steve requested that Doug ask John for a conference table to support the WinCo fundraiser.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 PM. The next board meeting will be on Thursday March 17, 2016, 6:00 PM at the H.H. Hall Building.
