There are some awesome opportunities for our club to shine at the Spring Conference.

The Five Minute Achievement Speech – a member would prepare a speech that lasts no longer than five minutes in which one of our major projects would be described. It might be about The Santa Store; The Berry Sales; The WSSB Track Meet; Walk and Knock; or our various Centennial Projects there are probably other good topics, as well.

Club folded brochure – Someone would need to look over our brochure and be sure all the information is accurate.

Club Bulletin/Newsletter - Newsletter must be published at least once a month. Notification of the club's newsletter with a link to it must be sent to the Club's District Governor and MD 19 Office each time it is published.

Club Business Card – All business cards are welcome.

Musical Comedy - With this year's theme of Hawaiian Fun Shirts and Hats there are probably many good ways to reword a Hawaiian song and develop some surfing type actions to go along with it. Hawaiian dress is usually easy to come up with if we check at the re-sale stores.

Musical Performance - In the past we have had several members perform in this category. John Caldwell plays his keyboard often (maybe this would be a good time for John to play his guitar.) We have others that are talented musically. Please consider entering this category.

Humorous Story – The story should be three minutes long – A ten point penalty will be assessed for each minute or portion thereof over three minutes. This can be about any topic – not necessarily Lions related. Judging will be based on delivery (15 points) Visual contact with audience (10 points) Speech tone, volume and speed (15 points) Facial expression (10 points) Humor (25 points) and crowd response (25 points.)

Uniform parade – If we wish to march in the uniform parade we will need to be dressed alike. In order to participate in this category we will need someone willing to take a lead role to help coordinate our choice of apparel.

Fort Vancouver Lions Board Meeting Friday, February 16, 2018, 10:30 am

King Lion Chriss Denny called the meeting to order at 10:36 a.m.

Board Members Present: Lions Chriss Denny, Doug Wilson, Lee Denny, Steve Seymour, Phyllis Goldhammer, Tony Licata, with Steve Staudinger acting as a board member. A quorum was present.

Minutes: The minutes from Friday, January 19, 2017 were presented. Steve Seymour made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Phyllis and the motion was passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Stephen Staudinger reported the beginning and ending balances as of January 31 in Gay's absence (Foundation: \$12804.24 start \$10373.21 end and Administration/Club: \$3571.11 start and \$1527.55 end excluding the investment account). He noted a returned check for the hat vendor for the Lambeque Project and that he would follow up with David Rich to address this.

Proposals for Board Consideration:

1. 1718-31. Eva made a motion to approve the \$100 Charity of the Month to be given to Bridges Between. Katherine Demsky, our speaker at last Friday's meeting, stated this non-profit supports the women's education in rural Nepal. Steve Seymour seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Board Members - Free Exchange of Information

King Lion Chriss reported on:

- **Plaques to commemorate the Lions Statue at WSSB** The Board previously approved the amount of \$3500 to purchase a Lion Statue to be placed at WSSB as one of our Centennial Projects. The school requested that we purchase a small statue which cost \$1979.01, leaving a balance of \$1521 approved. The school has now requested up to \$500 for the construction of two plaques to commemorate the Lions Statue. One plaque will be written in print, the other in Braille. Both plaques will be mounted near the statue by WSSB staff and will include verbiage stating the statue was donated by our club as part of the LCI Centennial Celebration. Plans include placement of the Lion on a lighted platform in the parking lot near the Stenhjem Activity Center. It will be unveiled during the WSSB Track Meet on May 17th. This will not need a motion to approve since the funds have been approved, but it needs to be noted in the minutes.
- **Wireless microphone** It was noted at our last meeting at the Elks Lodge that a wireless microphone will be needed to be used during Tail Twister Time and for other announcements from the floor. Roy Pulliam has purchased a microphone and we will be testing it at the meeting Friday. If it works well, we will reimburse Roy – if not we will try another type.
