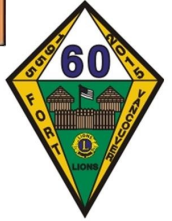

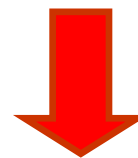
eager to see how things change as our next generation of Lions steps up to man the helm.

**Minutes:** The minutes from Friday, February 16, 2017 had been sent to the Board. Phyllis Goldhammer made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Len Leger and the motion was passed unanimously. Correspondence: There was no correspondence.
