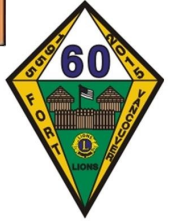

This year's track meet at the Washington State School for the Blind on May 17th was a huge success. We were blessed with wonderful weather, we had plenty of volunteers, and most importantly everyone had lots of fun.

Over 100 student athletes from all over Washington and Oregon, ran, jumped and threw all day long. No matter what their disability, they competed with smiles on their faces as everyone cheered them on. Events included sprints and long distance runs, standing and running long jump, the shot put and modified throw, turbo javelin and the high jump.

We served approximately 325 athletes and their families, all of the volunteers, and the staff Johnsonville Brats for lunch. Johnsonville donated the brats. Frito Lay donated chips. Tracy Hein of Sacred Grounds Coffee donated all of the hot dog buns. Winco donated potato and macaroni salad and cases of water. Both Johnsonville, Winco and Tracy have donated to the lunches year after year. If you get a chance buy a coffee from Tracy at Sacred Grounds in the old IGA parking lot and thank her. Lions Rick Giles and Steve Staudinger were the cooks for lunch.

Nineteen Lions and 13 friends volunteered to work this annual community service event. We worked 156 hours and we came in under budget with a total of \$287.70 in expenses. We received many compliments and thank yous for hosting the track meet. It is such a pleasure to chair this event with all of the support from our members and the community. 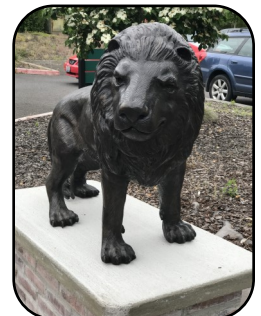

Fort Vancouver Lions Present Lion Statue to the Washington State School for the Blind

On May 17, 2018, the Fort Vancouver Lions Club Statute was dedicated in a ceremony presided over by WSSB Superintendent Scott McCallum. In his remarks, he noted the Lion is the WSSB mascot but nowhere on campus was there a statue of a lion that blind children could see or feel. With donation of this bronze Lion statue by the Fort Vancouver Lions that was no longer the case. The Lion statue has been installed on a brick platform in the parking lot serving the Irwin and the Stenehjem Buildings.

After the dedication several Lions provided guided tours to guide blind children to the statue where they could see/feel the shape and size of the Lion. At the base of the statue there will be two signs installed (one in Braille and one in print) which state the Lion statue was donated by the Fort Vancouver Lions Club to commemorate the Lions Centennial (1917-2017).

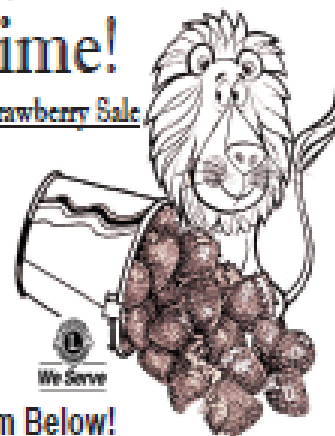
