This being said, young adults are much more interested in hands-on activities rather than long club meetings. There may be some changes our club needs to make in order to accommodate a young adult's lifestyle.

Young adults use the Internet for just about everything, from paying bills and shopping online to communicating with friends and family. The Internet also serves as the go-to resource for young adults when researching just about everything. Before deciding to join or attending an event, young adults will use the Internet to learn about our club. We need to continue to have a club website that is attractive, up-to-date and provides all the information they want, including meeting information, a calendar of events and service project descriptions with pictures.

So, at the request of our younger members we are planning to add a once a month social evening where we prompt our younger members and their friends to attend.

We have chosen the 3rd Thursday of the month to hold these socials. Each month we will choose one FVLC activity to support i.e. (Hunger, Vision, Diabetes, etc.) We will identify upcoming activities during the social to support the effort, for instance: As an example, each month we will support a Lions club activity such as "Vision" where

we would market the benefits of being a member of our Lions Club to those who attend by:

Encouraging the attendees to bring a pair of lightly used glasses to donate
Holding a fun 50/50 raffle to raise funds (same format as lunches)

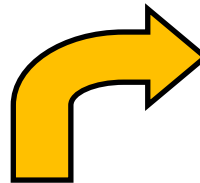
