#### **CHANGE IS HARD**

Over the past several months our club has been wrestling with how do we keep doing the great community work that we do with an aging volunteer base. We have a list of long time projects that we have been asking club members to take on and have found that a lot of our long time members no longer feel they have the health, time, inclination and/or energy to take them on. We put out a survey several months ago to try to get an indication from our club members on whether our club is going in the right direction or is some change needed to keep us viable. Generally (85-90%) thought the meetings were well run, everybody had a chance to participate and the speakers were good but 65% would like us to cut back on our meetings. After much discussion by the board it was decided that starting in July the club is going to meet on the 1st and 3rd Friday of the month instead of weekly. There is the hope that this move will help us involve more community young adults to become part of our great club.

Contrary to popular belief, young adults want to volunteer and are volunteering at a higher rate than normal. This is good news for us because attracting and retaining younger Lions is vital to perpetuate our club. Attracting young adults can be a challenge; therefore, we may need to revitalize how we operate and how our members think in order to get young adults involved. This is a first change in that direction.

Young people gravitate toward others like themselves, and a good approach is to recruit with our youngest members which is why we have asked Tim Ragland to be our membership chair. Seeing someone of a similar age, lifestyle and perspective enjoying Lions service is a convincing reason to join.

Dues can also be a sensitive subject when approaching a prospective member, so it is important that we have a plan of approach. The concern of most young adults is where their money is going. Therefore, when discussing dues, explain that there is a one-time entrance fee and breakdown how much of their annual does goes to the club, the district and LCI.

As I said in the headline "Change is Hard" but if we are to continue to grow and thrive for another 65 years we must change with the times.
