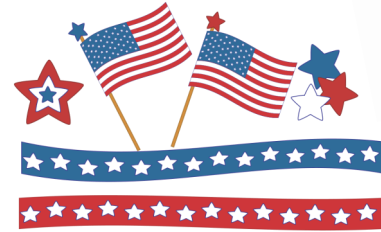

Secretary's Report:

Minutes: The minutes of the April 19, 2019 board meeting were unanimously approved as distributed.

Correspondence: There was no new correspondence to discuss.

Treasurer's Report:

Proposals for Board Consideration:

1. 18-19-22 Revisit of meeting schedule decision: Board Members as well as Len and Jen Leger reported that most people wanted to maintain weekly meetings instead of the bi-monthly meetings that had been proposed to start in July. A variety of reasons were presented including the thought that decreasing our meeting schedule would be confusing to clubs that wanted to visit. A motion was made and seconded that we maintain our regular weekly meeting schedule. The vote was unanimous.

2. 18-19-22 Charity of the month: Len Leger proposed we donate \$100.00 to Gales Creek Camp. Gay moved we select Gales Creek Camp as the charity of the month and donate the \$100.00 to them. Motion was seconded by Carol Cooper. The motion passed unanimously.

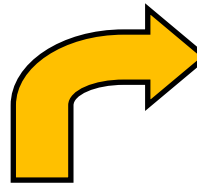
