This year's track meet at the Washington State School for the Blind on May 16th was a huge success. We were blessed with wonderful weather, we had plenty of volunteers, and most importantly everyone had lots of fun.

Over 100 student athletes from all over Washington and Oregon, ran, jumped and threw all day long. No matter what their disability, they competed with smiles on their faces as everyone cheered them on. Events included sprints and long distance runs, standing and running long jump, the shot put and modified throw, turbo javelin and the high jump. We served approximately 325 athletes and their families, all of the volunteers, and the staff, Johnsonville Brats for lunch. Johnsonville donated the brats. Frito Lay donated chips. Tracy Hein of Sacred Grounds Coffee donated all of the hot dog buns. Winco donated potato and macaroni salad and cases of water. Both Johnsonvile, Winco and Tracy have donated to the lunches year after year. If you get a chance buy a coffee from Tracy at Sacred Grounds in the old IGA parking lot and thank her. Lions Rick Giles and Steve Staudinger were the cooks for lunch.

19 Lions and 13 friends volunteered to work this annual community service event. We worked 156 hours and we came in under budget with a total of \$287.70 in expenses. - 18-19-22 Hosting of a hospitality suite at the Spring Conference in honor of 1st Vice District Governor Stephen Staudinger. Following discussion a motion was made by Ken Milligan moved that we fund a hospitality suite Saturday May 18th for a maximum of \$200.00 The motion was seconded by Gay Enyeart. The motion was approved unanimously.

General Membership Comments or Reports: (This is a time for Board members to <u>listen</u> to club members It may be appropriate for Board members to ask clarifying question, generally no immediate action or debate is appropriate during this segment)

Board Members Free Exchange of Information:

- 1. **Nominating Committee** : All positions have been filled. Martha Johnson moved we accept this slate of officers. Gay Enyeart seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved. Voting will take place at the regular club meeting on April 26th.

Bill Lundin expressed concern of withdrawals from endowment fund, but no additions. These are the past withdrawals: 2017: \$10,000, 2018: \$5,000 approx, and so far 2019: \$3,760. Discussion of potential fundraisers: Dinner/auction with much job sharing to lighten work-loads, an event similar to White Cane, and writing of grants. The Firstenberg Grant was mentioned.

Old Business: We are still looking at 100 Men for potential fundraising. Discussion was carried over to June meeting because of 66 applications to review. Dean Stenehjem is willing to make the presentation to the 100 Men group.

New Business: Steve Seymour led a discussion for officers for 2019-2020 year. Nominations will be finalized in June. Preliminary slate is: Jeff Fish moves up to President; Marilan Anderson new to Vice- President; Susan Nellor to continue as Secretary; Ralph Harding to continue as Treasurer; Patient Care position is still open. Discussion about Patient Care position took place. Stream-lining of job was mentioned, including job sharing and including clubs in the process, but no action was taken.

Patient Care: 66 applications presented, 65 approved, 1 rejected (question about income)

Adjourned: 7:40. Next meeting will be June 4, 2019
