His uncounted volunteer hours of service to our community and especially to the Washington State School for the Blind has been exemplary. The school for the blind is placing a Peace Pole at the school to memorialize the service Roy and his wife Lori have given to the service of helping blind students. Thank you for being an awesome Lion and an amazing human being. We love you!

I am looking forward to the rest of 2020, a Roaring Lion year, because we have lots of interesting Service projects, fundraisers and training scheduled. There will be a Learning Forum at the Columbia Tech Center that is completely free for Lions. Fort Vancouver Lions will again raise money on White Cane Day to assist the blind. We will be having a fundraising event to support diabetes research at Hazel Dell Lanes, we are calling it Bowling Down Diabetes. Gay Enyeart is heading up the committee. This



will be lots of fun even if you are not a champion bowler.

Our Lions will again be selling berries, lots and lots of fresh and frozen berries this year as our main fundraiser. Several Fort Vancouver Lions will continue volunteering for Friends In Service to Humanity (FISH) weekly to distribute food to needy families. Five Lions prepare each month and serve a meal each month at Share House for the homeless. We will be prepping for and serving a meal at the Tour de Cure to raise money for Diabetes Research in Aloha, Oregon. The Walk and Knock to get food for Clark County's Food Bank is a community service project Fort Vancouver Lions have participated in since it began, and we will again support it in 2020. We will be serving Washington Elementary School on several occasions: the end of BBQ, Curriculum school night, serving Thanksgiving dinner and the Santa's Store. Fort Vancouver Lions will be helping to clean up Gales Creek, a camp for diabetic children.

Fort Vancouver Lions Honor Lion Roy Pulliam

On January 25, 2020, 90 Lions and their guests gathered at Club Green Meadows to pay tribute to Lion Roy Pulliam for his outstanding service to the club and the community for the past 33 years.

King/Queen Lion Eva Halter opened the evening by introducing the emcees for the night: Lion Shelly Brown and Lion Rick Giles. Next all those in attendance introduced themselves and their guests which was followed by a wonderful invocation by Lion Bruce Armstrong. Everyone enjoyed an excellent buffet featuring prime rib and salmon.




After dinner the emcees reviewed Lion Roy's achievements and awards. His projects raised over \$200,000 for the club and he brought over 30 new members into the club.

One of the highlights of the evening was the presentation of the presidential award by MD 19 Council Chair JD Nellor, MD 19 Executive Director Peter Anderson and District Governor Steve Staudinger. This is one of the highest awards in Lionism.

Superintendent Scott McCullum, WSSB, presented the Pulliam Peace Pole Award to Lions Roy and Lori Pulliam for their lifetime service to the school. The Pulliam Peace Pole will be installed in the center of the WSSB campus near 'Ned's Shed' which overlooks the WSSB track. This unique monument consists of the phrase "May Peace Prevail On Earth" displayed in 13 languages (including Braille) representing the students who have attended the school. The plan is to unveil the monument during the 2020 WSSB track meet.

Lion Martha Johnson presented a photo quilt of her own design and creation which consisted of photographs of Lions in action over the years. This quilt measuring 36" by 95" was displayed during the celebration for all in attendance to sign.

Another highlight of the evening was the video presentation of Lion Roy's performances in past benefit concerts.







The evening ended with a wonderful music program by Judy Koch-Smith and Doug Smith.

Who's Who in Fort Vancouver Lions Club

Our life —— Lee and Chriss Denny. We were born in Colorado- Lee in Alamosa and Chriss in Colorado Springs. Lee lived several different places while growing up: Colorado, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico and was back in Colorado Springs for his last years of high school. There he met Chriss through mutual friends. However, we didn't date until a few years later when we were re-introduced by mutual friends. We got to know each other while playing the card game of Pitch with the couple that introduced us. We were married in 1962.

By 1968 we had three sons — Ron, Eric and Steve. We had moved to Scappoose in 1965 when Lee's dad applied by proxy for Lee for a cable splicer position with the Rose Valley Telephone company in Scappoose, OR, and he was hired.

It was in Scappoose that we both started doing volunteer work. Lee volunteered for the volunteer fire department, served on the city planning commission, and was a scout leader. Chriss served on the kindergarten school board, was a Cub Scout leader, and a Sunday School teacher.

Lee worked in telecommunications for 37 years, starting as a lineman, and ending his time as an outside plant coordinator in Vancouver, where the Telecom corporate offices were located. He retired at age 55 to pursue the activities he really wanted to do, such as: golfing, traveling, dancing, photography backpacking, camping, collecting stuff, and spending time with children and grandchildren. You might want to ask him about his varied collections sometime.

Chriss worked for school districts in the towns in which we lived. I started as playground/lunchroom supervisor in Scappoose; Special Ed assistant, Special Ed Secretary, and Secretary to the Superintendent in Lebanon, and Secretary in the Evergreen Schools Special Ed Adminstrative office in Vancouver. When Lee retired I was still working and this just didn't seem right to me. I retired shortly thereafter. I made quilts for all of my grandchildren, learned to play golf (sort of), participated in the camping and backpacking activities (but I was always lagging behind), enjoyed dancing, traveling, and doing activities with the grandkids. According to our old home movies I especially enjoyed making cookies with them. This tradition continues today with our great granddaughter.

Lee joined the Lions because he appreciated their motto "We serve." He served on practically every committee and held every office except for Secretary over the years. He also served as Zone Chair in 2008-09. Chriss joined the club in 2005 when Lee was serving as President and has held the following offices: Secretary, Director, First VP, and President. They are both Melvin Jones Fellows.

In 2019 we moved to Salem to be near our youngest son and his family. We have seven grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

We miss our Fort Vancouver Lions friends, so we always enjoy dropping in on a luncheon meeting or special events.
