

Vancouver with 84 new cases reported. So the future is still uncertain. The one thing I do know that as Lions we will always find a way to serve. While several fundraisers and service projects were cancelled we were able to help our community is several ways.

Last summer we assisted with the Tour de Cure in Hillsboro. Our Lions, Bill Shalaby, Gay Enveart, Helen Sutfin and Eva Halter volunteered at the Tour de Cure in Hillsboro, OR to raise money to fight Diabetes. Tour de Cure is for people of all cycling abilities, featuring 5 wellmarked cycling routes with safety marshals and safety vehicles, and fully stocked rest stops to fuel the journey! The 5K run and walk routes are a great way to get out, have fun, and to celebrate those living with Diabetes. Our Lions were assigned to food preparation and serving the food. The weather was perfect

and the food was delicious. The event raised more than \$200,000 to fight Diabetes.

This Year's Walk N' Knock was the best ever. It was extremely well organized by Adam Hegewald. In fact, the bag folding day had so many volunteers that the bags were folded before the pizzas were delivered for lunch for the first time in recent memory. Great job Adam, over 275,000 pounds of food and over \$10,000 was collected in Clark County by more than 3,000 volunteers.

Our Lions worked on the welcome boxes for Office Moms & Dads volunteers, to be given to children coming into foster care. These boxes have age appropriate toys and games, socks and underwear, and some snacks. To date, we have provided 36 boxes. The Lions who worked on that donation were Georgie Jackson, Jen Leger, Joanne Zimmer, John Lion, Gay Enyeart, and Eva Halter.

Steve Seymour was a wonderful Santa and Gail Seymour was his faithful helper. We had gifts for every child and their families. The teachers are so grateful for Ft. Vancouver Lions help to make Christmas special for every family represented in their school. We

Although we were not able to do everything we wanted to do for our community because of the quarantine to keep the Covid-19 virus from spreading, we were able to have a positive impact on our community. # Happy 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Ft. Vancouver Lions

In January of 1955 the first board of Ft. Vancouver Lions met to decide to organize a Lions Club. On April 15, 1955 Fort Vancouver Lions Club was established. There was already a Lions Club, Vancouver Lions. However the business men in the club wanted to have a Lions Club that was expressly for business leaders in the community, with a lunch time meeting. There



were 38 charter members, 4 new members and 34 transferred members from Vancouver Lions. The dues were \$16 annually per member. The meetings were weekly at the American Legion in downtown Vancouver. The first speaker of the new club was Judge Cushing of Clark Superior Court, his subject was Juvenile Delinquency. The original Board Members were:
