Yard Cleanup Service Project

Here's an opportunity to get outside, get some light exercise, share in community service, and see your fellow club members in person! Green thumb or not and rain or (hopefully) shine, we have a service opportunity Saturday October 17th from 10:00am to 4:00pm or any portion of that time window you can make. If you can only give a couple of hours that would be fine. The activity is to help clean up the yard of an elderly woman. A long-time Vancouverite, her husband passed away about 5 years ago and although the yard gets mowed, flower beds have been neglected and invasive species have crept over from a neighbor's property. The plan is to remove the invasive plants, dig up the grasses and weeds choking the flower beds, and otherwise do what needs to be done. Vegetation removed will be placed in a trailer for recycling.

We will be outside but COVID restrictions (masking) will apply to volunteers who are within 6 feet of each other. What to bring: COVID mask, water and a lunch if needed, yard and garden tools like shovels, rakes, hoes, good gloves, appropriate dress for weather, and sunglasses if we get lucky enough to need them. A bathroom will be available at a house across the street.

Where: at a house near Club Green Meadows which is at 78th Street and 72nd Ave. The exact address will be shared with those who sign up for the project.

• Fort Vancouver Lions continue to harvest food from the Heritage Farm Garden. We have been working on Wednesday mornings in the garden to help supply the Clark County Food Bank with fresh vegetables and fruits. Michele Drushel, Eva Halter and Jennifer Denny were our September volunteers. Work was halted one Wednesday because of smoke that caused dangerous levels of pollution. Also, last Wednesday we were rained out; while the rain was a blessing and cleaned the air, the fields were too muddy to work in. We have been taking the unsold produce from the Farmers Market to the food bank as well. The Farmers Market was closed one weekend this month because of the smoke pollution. Jennifer Denny has been our faithful Sunday volunteer.

• A sixteen-year-old youth was in need of new shoes. Georgi Jackson. Len & Jen Leger, Gay Enyeart, Michele Drushel and Eva Halter joined funds and took the youth shoe shopping. It was very satisfying to see this young person get to pick out the shoes of her choice.

• The food bank distribution center is typically short on peanut butter. Fred Meyer had a special on the 16 ounce plastic jar of peanut butter, which made the perfect opportunity to help out at a discount price. Allen Rhyasen, Len & Jen Leger, Gay Enyeart, and Eva Halter were able to donate 71 jars of peanut butter to the food bank in in September.

These are just three ways Fort Vancouver Lions are continuing to serve our community even during the Covid-19 Crisis.

Via Zoom in the time of the COVID-19 Pandemic

The meeting was called to order by Queen Lion Gay Enveart at 10:15 AM. Board Members present: Queen Lion Gay Enveart, Allen Rhyasen, Bill Shalaby, Rick Giles, Craig Limoges, Helen Sutfin, Eva Halter, Martha Johnson, Dotty Scott, DeAnn Miller, and Steve Staudinger. A quorum was present.

Standard Reports to the Board:

Secretary's Report: A motion was made by Rick Giles, seconded by Allen Rhyasen and approved to accept the minutes from the July 17 meeting.

Treasurer's report: Rick Giles reported on the Administrative and Foundation reports for this month. After the budget is approved, he will be able to indicate the year to date information versus budget. The Treasurer's report will stand as presented pending audit.

Old Business

NAMI or Club Rejuvenation Pilot Project Lion Craig Limoges presented as a part of the 20-21.2 Membership Committee that they met with Stephanie O'Dell and Mark Mansell. A "test" survey was sent to the 4 committee members. The committee has decided on a survey to be sent out to members. A hard copy will be sent to those not using email. Those using email will receive it via Survey Monkey. The surveys are due by August 28th. Mark Mansell will present as the speaker the first 2 meetings in September. The committee is planning to have a finalized Membership Plan by the end of September.

20-21.3 Club Policies and Procedures Lion Helen Sutfin has requested that this be tabled until next month due to committee meeting restrictions and multiple changes being made. They will be ready to present at the September Board Meeting.

20.21.4 New Budget Lion Rick Giles presented the new Administrative and Foundation Budgets to the Board. After much discussion of how funding should be allocated. It was decided that Rick would update the budgets and resend them to the Board for email approval.

20.21.6 Roster Book Update Lion Craig Limoges presented that all of the information for the roster book is completed. He has communicated with PIP Printing and the rosters will be going to print soon. He also confirmed that the year of birth will NOT be printed in the roster. That information was only collected to update the LCI website.

New Business

Service Projects Lion Bill Shalaby presented about the 2020-2021 chairs of the Service Projects. The Washington Elementary School chair will be Martha Johnson, assisted by Jennifer Denny and Eva Halter. Nancy Brown will chair the Share House project. Environmental Projects will be chaired by Doug Wilson. Adam Hegewald will chair the Walk & Knock project. The Diabetes project of Tour de Cure will be chaired by Craig Limoges. Len Leger will contact Gales Creek Camp for that project, as well as the Children's Cancer Camps. WSSB Track Meet will be chaired by Lori Pulliam and Gay Enveart will assist her. CC Hearing will be chaired by Rick Giles and Bill will check with Ralph Harding about the CC Sight Committee. There is a question of how the Boy Scouts will be able to meet, so no chair at this time.

After a discussion of how to participate in a School Supply Drive, it was suggested that our club focus on getting school supplies for the students at Washington Elementary School since we already have a connection to that school. Lion Martha is in contact with Elizabeth regarding this project. It was moved by Craig Limoges, seconded by Allen Rhyasen and approved that we table the request for school supplies from the Salvation Army.

20.21.7 Charity of the Month Tabled until next month due to time constraints.
20.21.8 Walk & Knock Give More 24 Tabled until next month due to time constraints.

20.21.9 Saturday Market Proposal Lion Eva Halter presented a proposal to the Board about a project involving moving produce from the Saturday Market on Sunday afternoons at 3:00 p.m. to be delivered to the Food Bank. She also presented a project involving picking vegetables at the Heritage Farm and delivering those to the Food Bank. Lion Craig moved, seconded by Lion Rick that the Board approve these as 2 separate projects. These proposals were both approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:35 a.m.

Lions Sight Foundation September 1, 2020 Zoom Meeting

Attending: Jeff Fish, David Page, Ralph Harding, Susan Nellor, Harry Barret, Mike McCamish, Margie Gaul, Kay Huse, Al Kosterman, and Bill Lundin.

6:30 Jeff Fish called the meeting to order. The minutes from March 2020 were approved as presented by Jeff.

Ralph Harding gave the Treasurers report: LSFOCC received \$15,000 from the Lynch Fund, \$10,000 from the Price Foundation, Vancouver Church gave a donation of \$500.00, Rene Hamel gave a donation of \$200.00. The Endowment Accounts (approx.. \$10,000) have been under the watchful eye of Ralph who transferred funds and added Grant funds to open a Savings Account with Umpqua Bank, \$39,600 for a total of approximately \$50,000. This figure is a combination of the checking and endowment amounts. Application approvals were suspended in March due to COVID and are just starting up again.

David Page updated us on the progress on the Community Foundation Give More 24 on line event chaired by Sherry Parker of the Salmon Creek Lions Club. This event is happening September 24, 2020. All monies gifted will go to the LSFOCC. Thank you Sherrie and David.

New Business: A motion was made to amend the LSFCC application to remove the citizenship question, while retaining the Clark County residency requirement. A lengthy discussion ensued and no action will be taken until all trustees can discuss this application change with their clubs and bring results back to a later meeting. The discussion included reviewing our operating procedures and Bylaws for compliance accuracy before individual Club discussion. Copies will be coming to each trustee.

Patient Care Coordinator (PCC) : David is processing on line applications as fast as he can. The backlog is disappearing. Bill Lundin, Susan Nellor and Ralph Harding will be working on the backlog of paper applications.
