
# Together We Can Do A Lot

On Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup>, Fort Vancouver Lions helped Office Moms & Dads get their new offices ready to move in. We tore off molding, scraped off the former tenant's name and logo from the glass of the front door, primed and painted 5 office spaces. The work was hard but the women truly enjoyed making the connection with others who want to serve our community.

Office Moms & Dads provide children coming into foster care a much needed kind and caring adult to comfort the anxious child who has just been removed from their home because of abuse or neglect. In the Department of Children Youth and Families (DCYF) office in Vancouver Office Moms and Dads play board or video games and provide snacks and a distraction so that child doesn't have to sit in the social worker's cubicle and listen to call after call being made to try to find a home for them.

Because of other community partners, there is a clothes closet for foster children in the Vancouver DCYF office with new clothes so Office Moms & Dads can give every child they serve 2 new outfits complete with underwear and socks. There are several church groups that provide a handmade quilt for each child coming into care. Also the owners of the McDonalds restaurants had provided a new duffle bag for each child to transport all of these new things. Working with Community Partners is making a big difference in the lives of children in foster care, a very vulnerable part of our population.





Over the years in my calling as a pastor I have had plenty of opportunities to serve others, but Lions Club offers one more venue. And I appreciate the friends and partners in service that I have met through Lions – yes, including those of you reading this article!

My personal life revolves around my family; Angie (married for 53 years), 3 children and 7 grandchildren (ages 2-21). **Treasurers Report:** Lion Rick gave the Treasurer's Report, noting that a computer was purchased, as authorized by the Board. \$305 was received by the Tail Twister. **Charity of the Month:** Lion Rick made a motion, seconded by Lion Allen, and approved by the Board to send a \$100 donation to the Columbia Play Project. Lion Bill made a motion, seconded by Lion Rick, and approved by the Board to send \$500 to the Hearing Committee and to the Sight Committee.

# Lions Sight Foundation of Clark County ZOOM Minutes May 4, 2021

**Attending:** Jeff Fish, Stephanie O'Dell, Bill Lundin, Ralph Harding, David Page, Michael McCamish, Susan Nellor.

Meeting called to order at 6:35 by Jeff Fish.

**Approval of April minutes:** Jeff Fish asked for a motion to accept the April minutes as presented. Motion made by Ralph and seconded by David Page.

**Approval of Treasurers report:** Jeff Fish asked for a motion to accept the report as presented. Motion made by David Page and seconded by Bill Lundin.

Ending balance from April is \$8,255.00. There were no receipts. 10 vouchers were disbursed totaling \$1,125.00.( There are 20 pending vouchers ). Endowment accounts total \$65,746.00. The total of endowments and April balance is \$72,876.00.

**New Business:** Bill Lundin requested that his name be removed from the slate of officers for the 2021-2022 year. Jeff Fish made a motion to add Stephanie O'Dell to the ballot of officers for the upcoming 2021-2022 year go fill the Vice President position. Motion made and approved.

The question was asked: How is the Sight Committee going to use the Zenni certificates/vouchers? Stephanie O'Dell explained the Zenni process and volunteered to be the Zenni PCC. Those in attendance discussed and decided upon the following Zenni restrictions: There will be a spending dollar limit, to be decided. The vouchers will cover basic glasses, no special coatings, basic frames, basic lenses unless prescribed by the Optometrist/Ophthalmologist. Motion made by Ralph Harding and seconded by Susan Nellor. There are no Zenni patients yet. The Sight Committee is looking for Patient #1, hopefully a 20 something client, this will probably be our target client, to try the Zenni experience.

The new partnerships with America's Best and Stanton Optical were discussed. Bill Lundin volunteered to be the point person for America's Best. There is the possibility of 5 vouchers per month from America's Best. Ralph will make contact with Ryan Bedroseian, the area manager.

Jeff Fish and Stephanie O'Dell reported on their presentation at the March Zone Meeting. The big surprise is that Clark County Lions do not know that the CCLSF is their own Foundation. Susan Nellor was assigned the task to make contact with the 13 incoming 2021-2022 Lions Club Presidents and trustees and get them included on the email meeting minutes. Bill Lundin volunteered to do the orientation of new Club Presidents and Secretaries and fully explain the function of the Sight Foundation and to make an ask to be included in their annual budgets.


**Old Business:** In the continuing search for a Patient Care Coordinator, Jeff Fish will draft a letter and send it to each of our partner Medical offices.


