

Fort Vancouver Lions Club & Foundation Board Meeting Friday, February 18, 2022 10:00 a.m. Via Zoom in the time of COVID-19

Oueen Lion Cheri called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m.

Board Members Present: Queen Lion Cheri, Rick Giles, Martha Johnson, Pati Sluys, Jennifer Denny & Shelly Brown. A quorum was present.

Queen Lion Cheri reminded the Board of the commitment we have all made to this organization. We as leaders set the stage for moving forward together as a team.

Lion Cheri suggested that we have a group email through the club website. Cheri will talk to Dotty about getting that set up. Cheri will craft an email with action items to send out to the Board after meetings.

Standard Reports to the Board:

Secretary's Report: A motion was made by Lion Rick to approve the December 17, 2021 and the January 21, 2022 meeting minutes as presented, seconded by Lion Martha. The motion was approved by the Board.

Treasurer's Report: Lion Rick reported that there were no red flags in our accounts. Until the Strawberry sales are completed, we are limited on the monies we can spend. There is money for critical issues, but not much else. He reported that the dues were paid to Lions Club International. The Treasurer's Report will stand pending observation.

OLD BUSINESS

Report on completed projects: Lion Cheri will work on getting a form on our club website for members to fill out after projects are completed.

Leadership positions to be filled: Our club has the following leadership positions available: 2nd Vice President (Fund raising), Membership Chair, Model Club Coordinator. We need to develop a structure to lead. Lion Martha suggested we strengthen our own group first before we try to recruit people. One example is: Hugs in the Parking Lot (HIP)! Lion Cheri is connecting with other club Presidents to find out what is working, what isn't working, etc. Lion Cheri recommended we set up descriptions for the various positions to help ensure success of all of our Board members.

In-person/Hybrid Club meetings: Lion Cheri suggested that we could look at resuming In-person meetings in May. Lion Martha suggested that an article asking people if they are interested, be written for the newsletter. Lion Martha will write that article.

Ilani Volunteer Event: Lion Cheri reported that this event begins this evening. We have several members who have volunteered to help at this event over the next 3 days.

NEW BUSINESS

Existing Club Member Outreach: Lion Cheri suggested we set up a method for contacting our existing members. Lion Martha agreed that we could divide up the club members to different Board members to contact on a varying basis. Lion Cheri will work with Lion Martha on setting up a plan for this. An informal gathering of the Board was planned for Friday, March 4, 2022 @ 5:00 p.m. at Lion Rick's house.

In-Person Meeting/Meeting 2 Times Per Month: Lion Rick reported that we will need a camera and a microphone system to make the meetings work for In-person and On-line. He said that Heathen Brewing has given us permission to meet there again. Lion Rick will lead a committee to work on this. Lion Rick will send out a survey asking for member's input on changing from weekly meetings to meeting 2 times per month.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:15 a.m.

Thanks to the generosity of the Lions Clubs of Clark County 20 pairs of eyeglasses were approved.




