

Queen Lion Cheri called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Board Members Present: Queen Lion Cheri, Mike Cavanaugh, Gay Enyeart, Martha Johnson, Michele Druschel, Pati Sluys, Jennifer Denny, and Shelly Brown. David Rich was also present.

Member Wins: Board members shared their wins for the previous month.

Standard Reports to the Board:

Secretary's Report: Lion Martha made a motion to approve the minutes from the April 22, 2022 Board Meeting as presented. Lion Michele seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

Treasurer's Report: Lion Rick was not available to be at this meeting. There was not a Treasurer's report for this meeting. Lion Cheri will ask Lion Rick to send a report to the Board.

OLD BUSINESS:

Credit Card Project: Lion Cheri showed the Board the updated Fort Vancouver Lions website. The Fresh Strawberry Order link is on the website. Customers can pay for their orders with a credit card through the website. Bill Shalaby will be taking some fliers to the conference to share with others.

Dues can be paid on-line as well as donations can be made on-line. When money comes to our club, that money is put into the correct account.

Berries Sale Project: Of the 31 berries sales orders so far, 26 have been placed on-line. There will be a phone calling tree to contact past customers.

Shred Day Event: Lion Cheri reported that the club has netted \$700-800 from the Shred Day Event. The total amount was divided between our club and the Salvation Army.

WSSB Track Meet: Lion Shelly reported that we have 18 volunteers. There is still time to get your Volunteer Application form completed. We have places if more people want to volunteer. The food is all ordered and arriving in the next few days. IQ Credit Union will reimburse the school for the ribbons, they will need a W9 from WSSB.

Meeting Location: Lion Cheri shared that the last meeting took place at the Heathen. The room seemed to be a good size for our group. The June meetings will take place at Fiesta Bonita, which is near Vancouver Mall and shares a parking lot with Shari's. The address is: 4708 NE Thurston Way, Vancouver, WA 98662. The parking is easy and free. Lion Cheri recommended that we send a survey out to members after we have our June meetings.

2022-2023 Officer List Submission: The list of officers for the 2022-2023 Lions year has been submitted to both LCI and to MD19.

NEW BUSINESS

Delegates for Voting: Our club will have 6 delegates for voting at the Spring Conference as well as for the Redistricting Vote. It was decided that we would choose the same 6 delegates for each vote. Jeff Fish called for a motion to approve minutes from June 7th meeting. Bill Lundin made motion, Harry Barrett seconded. Vote taken, minutes approved.

Jeff Fish called for a motion to accept Treasurers report as presented orally over ZOOM. Bill Lundin made the motion, David Page seconded. Vote take, motion passed. Here is the report as heard over ZOOM. Checking account balance \$4,832.75. This reflects \$500.00 donation from Battleground Club, rebate of \$40.00 from Vancouver Eyecare. *spotty reception \$ 50.00 ?, \$200.75?

Disbursements: \$864.00 to David Page, PCC computer 19 vouchers paid \$2,175 (un-redeemed vouchers \$2,300)

Current Checking account balance \$1,793 Debit card balance of \$727.00

Endowment Report: Savings \$69,609 Vanguard Investments \$10,753 Total Cash \$82,882

Miscellaneous Treasurers Information: 2021-2022 Club Donations were \$11,708. In a non covid environment donations were as much as \$20,000.

Adams Insurance has not yet billed us for Directors Insurance.

New Business:

2022-2023 slate of officers presented for consideration Jeff Fish as Chairperson Nina Day as Vice Chairperson Susan Nellor as Secretary Ralph Harding as Treasurer Patient Care Team : Roxanne Cortez and Nancy Williams (Amy McKenna resigned) Current Chair Jeff Fish called for a motion to accept the 2022-2023 slate of officers. Bill Lundin made the motion, seconded by Ralph Harding. Vote taken, motion passed.

PCC Report: 21 applications were received. 19 were approved. The 2 denials were one was too soon, and the other was a residency issue.

Demographics of approved applications: one from Battleground, 2 from Washougal, five from Hazel Dell and Salmon Creek area and the balance from Vancouver area and Homeless Shelters.

Of the 19, one eye exam was paid for, and 18 were eyeglasses 8 were male, 11 were female, from 28 to 78

years of age. Misc. notes: Acceptance of Medicare patients is becoming more difficult. Ralph is working on trying to find more willing providers for our Medicare clients.

Nina Day is continuing on her cost analysis of services project.

Meeting adjourned 7:20
