#### Fort Vancouver Lions Club & Foundation Board Meeting Friday, September 9, 2022 1:00 p.m. Fiesta Bonita and Zoom in the time of COVID-19

Lion Martha called the meeting to order at 1:08 p.m.

**Board Members Present:** Martha Johnson, Allen Rhyasen, Michele Druschel, Mike Cavanaugh, Shelly Brown and Don Mitchell as a temporary Board member.

#### Standard Reports to the Board:

**Secretary's Report:** An update to the August minutes. Lion Patty will be gone for the Santa Store, Lion Helen will co-chair. Lion Allen made a motion to approve the minutes from the August 5, 2022 meeting with the updated information. Lion Mike seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the Board.

**Treasurer's Report:** Lion Rick wasn't present to give a Treasurer's Report. It was noted that there are many outstanding member's dues checks that need to be deposited into the bank.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**Game Night:** Not sure if there will be a game night in September. Lion Allen suggested having a happy hour event on the last Friday in September. Lion Allen will check if there is a charge to use the side room at Gustav's. He will report back to the Board through email.

**Clark County Relay:** Lion Cheri sent a message to Lion Allen about this event. The sign-up sheet was not available at the regular meeting.

Canned Food Drive: Lion Martha made a motion to invite members to bring canned food to each of the 2 meetings per month. The motion was seconded by Lion Michele. The motion was passed by the Board. **Gee Creek Rest Area:** Lion Martha has completed the application to the WA DOT, but has not heard back about the application. Her first choice is November 12, with October 28 or 29th as her second choices. We will be able to plan for this when the application is approved.

**WA Elementary Thanksgiving Lunch:** Lion Martha will need 7-8 volunteers to help serve lunch on November 17th, but a show of force is good. Volunteers need to be cleared by Vancouver School District to work at this event. Lion Shelly offered to look into getting vests for more Lions who don't have them.

**Santa Store:** The Santa Store is scheduled for December 14 for set up and the 15th for shopping for the students. We will need volunteers to help with this event!

Frozen Berries: The gross sale was \$8,760, and the net sale was \$3,320 to the club. The Frozen Berries sale was a success. We will continue to work with them next year.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**New Location Committee:** It was decided that it will be hard to have a committee to work on this idea. He will check with Gustav's to see if their side room is an option. Lion Allen suggested that we go back to the Heathen in October. The downside is the parking. It helps to have a place that will hold all our paraphernalia. Lion Allen will check on the availability of a room at Gustav's. We need to check on getting a microphone that can be closer to the speaker.

Amazon Smile Initiative: A discussion was held about having someone help club members at a meeting to sign up for Amazon Smile before or after the meeting.

**December Christmas Meeting:** Lion Martha has asked Lion John to call Club Green Meadows and Royal Oaks Country Club about an event on December 16 or 17th. Lion Martha and Lion John will work to plan this event.

**WA Elementary School:** Lion Martha reported the WA Elementary Curriculum Night will be September 28th from 5-6 p.m. The next event will be the Art Night on October 27.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:00 p.m. Next meeting will be October 7, 2022 at 1:00 p.m.
