ZONE MEETING MINUTES September 20, 2022 via ZOOM

Present: Moderator PCC J. D. Nellor, Vancouver; PZC Helen Sutfin, Fort Vancouver; PZC Ryan Morrison, Hazel Dell President; Don Stose, Ridgefield President; DG Debbie Mansell; David Goggin, Vancouver Dawn President; Sam Gunn, Salmon Creek President; Janet Bausch, La Center President; PDG Kathy Morrison, Hazel Dell Secretary; Doug Ballou, Salmon Creek Secretary; Shelley Staudinger, Battle Ground Secretary; Martha Johnson, Fort Vancouver 1st Vice President; Mary Peck, Vancouver President; Allen Rhyasen, Fort Vancouver.

Meeting called to order at 6:30pm.

Moderator PCC J. D. Nellor welcomed everyone to the Zone Meeting. He called the roll. Clubs represented were Battle Ground, Hazel Dell, La Center, Ridgefield, Salmon Creek, Vancouver, Vancouver Dawn, and Fort Vancouver. North Clark President David Lund notified Zoom sender PZC Ryan to say that he would be out of the country.

PCC J. D. Nellor introduced DG Debbie Mansell.

PCC J. D. Nellor reported on the redistricting status. The formal request to redistrict MD19 was submitted to LCI on time. At this time the biggest issue seems to be how to renumber the zones. The redistricting committees are working to smooth out the "bumps." There will be an election before the end of the year so the "District N" officers will be eligible to attend district governor and zone chair trainings.

DG Debbie Mansell explained that PDG Mark Mansell is now the District G merger chair because PDG Kathy Crawford had to step down due to health issues. He will meet with District C merger chair PDG Marilyn Danby next week to discuss progress.

CLUB REPORTS

President Janet Bausch reported that in July La Center held officer installation and inducted new member Kat Rodgers into Lionism and they have another new member to induct. Their fireworks stand was successful. DG Debbie Mansell made her official visit. Some of their members helped at the Ilani event; she thanked Ridgefield for organizing it and including other clubs. They are ordering new chains for the "chain gang," club members who volunteers to help at high school football games. They will be honored for their service at the October 28 game. They help with "Wonderful Onesies." They applied to LCIF for a grant to upgrade the school lunch silverware. Their Leo Club is growing and developing more service projects. Allen Rhyasen asked "What are wonderful onesies?" Janet explained that they are one piece infant wear. When babies needed chemo, they had to be undressed so the "port" for the tubing was accessible. That meant they were cold because the room where chemo is administered has to be cold. PZC Edie Bannon, La Center, redesigned a onesie with a flap that can be opened over the port so the baby can remain dressed while receiving chemo treatment.

President Don Stose reported that PDG Terry Sutfin and PZC Helen Sutfin had inducted new members at the Ridgefield installation. Ridgefield was very busy at the Clark County Fair. They participated in the Ridgefield sausage fest and the Ilani wine fest. They will volunteer at the Ilani Octoberfest. They have been helping two Ukrainian families with finances and with accessing services. They will be reaching out to other clubs to help with the Ilani Octoberfest October 8 and 9.

Hazel Dell President reported that the club is gradually transitioning out of COVID and back into activities. They sponsored the first motorcycle run for sight since June, 2019. The fireworks sales were successful. They spent a weekend cleaning out the semi trailers that had been used for storage for many years and hauled lots of stuff to Goodwill and lots of stuff to the dump. They have held two in person meetings.

President David Goggin reported that Vancouver Dawn is assimilating new members. The new members are younger people and want to redo the club Facebook and web site. They are partners with the Downtown Vancouver Association and help with landscaping. They are well into planning for the Crystal Plum Bazaar to be held at Alki Middle School November 12. They now meet at Paul's Restaurant on the second and fourth Tuesdays at 7:30am.

Salmon Creek President Sam Gunn said that they will be helping set up for the Crystal Plum Bazaar. They had a great 40th Anniversary evening with lots of guests, video presentations, and awards. They applied for a grant from the Price Foundation to purchase a new vision screening camera. They will hold a shred event October 15, proceeds earmarked for Evergreen Habitat for Humanity. They are not screening in Vancouver School District. They teach the school nurses to use the cameras and then lend the cameras to them. They do screen at schools in the Gorge and have had help from other clubs. To sign up to help, go to the Salmon Creek Lions web site and open the calendar. They cleaned 119th Street and will clean the Salmon Creek Trail.

Mary Peck, Vancouver President reported that they did road cleanup on Hazel Dell Avenue. They had meetings at member homes during the summer. They will now be meeting in the West Park Community Room at 610 Esther Street. They are planning a Harvest (Halloween) Party. They are considering whether to re-activate the Hawaiian raffle that was a major source of income for them pre-Covid. She asked what

to do about notifying others when a glasses drop site stops accepting glasses.

PCC J. D. said we need to let everyone know which sites are no longer accepting glasses. The names of those businesses need to be taken off the posted lists.

Martha Johnson, Fort Vancouver 1st Vice President reported that the berries had new packaging. There were some complaints about the fresh berries and they are looking for a different provider for next year. They volunteered at the Washington Elementary Back-to-School Night and handed out t-shirts and popsicles. They are meeting at La Fiesta Bonita on the first and third Fridays at noon. They are preparing for the Washington Elementary School Santa Store.

Secretary Shelley Staudinger, Battle Ground, reported that they had a successful Duck Pond work party. The water is low so they found lots of trash to pick up. They are participating in Give More 24 with the

proceeds to go to the North County Food Bank. They are expanding their efforts in the schools.

PZC Helen Sutfin asked if G-2 Lions would be interested in training for emergency preparedness. Club representatives present indicated an interest. Helen will talk to CRESA which now does the training for the Red Cross Emergency Group. The training is probably eight hours and needs to be repeated annually. For example, trainees learn to handle and set up equipment and take registration. We need a Zone Chair.

DG Debbie and PDG Mark just returned from the USA/Canada Forum. Multiple District 19's annual convention is in Penticton October 13-15, 2022. She is working with ilani as a likely venue for her District G Conference May 12-13, 2023.

The next Zone Council meeting is October 18. Salmon Creek President Sam Gunn will be the moderator. In closing PCC J.D. Nellor commented that it is great to be doing things and trying new things; and don't be afraid to re-invent things.

Meeting adjourned at 7:40 p.m.




