





Fort Vancouver Lions Fruit Sale

On July 22nd 2023, 17 Lions & friends delivered fruit to our customers in Clark County.

Fruit Sales were started 33 years ago by Lion Tom Gay.

We 1st started out with fresh strawberries & 17 years ago we added Frozen Fruit.

Tom had the idea, that we presell the fruit & have 1 day for delivery at 6 locations in Clark County. That continues now, as about 2 months before the sale these locations are contacted to advise them of our date for delivery. (asking permission to continue as well)

A reminder follow up call is made the week prior to the call.

Lee Denny (a previous Fort Vancouver Lion) a number of years ago developed a flow chart showing action items-- that starts about **90 days prior** to the sale. This flow chart has been slightly adjusted but really helps us keep on task.

Our fruit supplier is contacted to confirm prices for the current year and supply availability of fruit. (Bill Shalaby & Allen Rhyasen)

60 days prior the fruit committee meets to review date of sale, sales price, 7 promotion pieces. (Kari Frabel is our promotion guru)

We currently promote our sale by using "mail chimp" to send out emails to about 800 previous customers, going back a few years. We send out about 4 or 5 email blasts for each sale.

Wanda Slevin has been our record keeper of our sales for about the last 10 years. (She spends about 50 hours each year recording current sales and handling all associated record keeping duties. Sale Begins

About **40 days prior**, promotion of berry sales begins, Dotty Scott will set up our Web Page along with TMC setting up payments so our customers can order on line. (This year 83% of sales were on line) Our 1st email blast is sent and club members are notified of the sale and encouraged to promote through Facebook, Next Door app, and sending emails to family and friends.

A sign up list for drivers and workers is completed, along with instructions for the day of delivery.

2 weeks prior to the end of sale, a phone committee (about 10 Lions) place calls to about 200 past customers who have most recently bought from us. A script is developed to help with the calls. (Wanda & Bill create this customer list)

The week of the sale a preliminary order is given to Columbia Fruit, after Wednesday of that week sales stop and web site is taken down.

On Thursday, Wanda gives final sales #'s that are communicated to Columbia Fruit, & creates location sales sheets that is reviewed by Bill with Kari (TMC) confirming all orders that have been ordered. On Saturday, (day of the pick-up) 6 drivers arrive at Columbia Fruit in Woodland at 8:30am to load their vehicles, (dry ice & blankets are supplied), fruit signs are handed out, along with their customer lists. Off they go to meet their fellow Lions volunteers at 9:30am to set up their site for Sales to begin at 10am or before.

There have been some changes over the years.

Prior to COVID we had a fresh strawberry sale in June which really appealed to jam makers as berries were cleaned & sliced & ready to go.

Columbia Fruit now only sells frozen berries.

One change that will be made next year will be added Frozen Strawberries in a bag (2½ lbs.) with no sugar added, just as the other frozen fruit is sold in bags.

This year our total sales and donations were \$7065. Expenses approximately \$4490

Net profit to club \$2575

Total man hours worked on this project were 140!

We had 7 new customers this year and the only way we can sell more is with new customers so member participation in promotion is critical to the success of this project.

Thanks again for your support and we're looking forward to next year's sale.

An Amazing Berry Customer

On July 22, 2023 we learned of the great lengths a customer of Ft. Vancouver Lions Club's annual berry sales went to in order to get their orders.

The pick-up site at the Umpqua Bank on Hwy. 99 in Hazel Dell was the spot for Lions Diane Cavanaugh, Terry and Helen Sutfin. Sales supporters were on time and eager to get the berries into freezers, jams or desserts.

As Lions Diane and Helen were 'shading' from the heat, a C-tran bus stopped down the street. Off the bus came a woman in an electric wheelchair. After the bus departed, the woman continued north and gradually came down the driveway to our berry station.

After pleasantries, she reported that she was there to collect her berries!

Lion Diane and I looked at each other in amazement while the woman began to pull several plastic bags from her tote.

When asked as to how she was going to get them home, she replied that she had several bags that she would put the berries into and then she would hang them for the back and handles of her chair and then was going to take a return C-tran bus!

One can only imagine, our awe and astonishment! The berries consisted of 6 pkgs., each weighing 2.5 lbs. How would she manage the additional 15 lbs? Would the frozen berries thaw before arriving home? Obviously, our cars were not equipped for an electric wheelchair, so taking her home was not an option. Turned out that she lived on Main Street. South of the berry pick-up location! YEAH! We would deliver her order.

The customer was, of course, thrilled for the service and we were more than glad to Serve.

She thanked us for the help, turned her chair around and slowly made her way up to the sidewalk, where she rode south for a bit, crossed Hwy. 99 and headed a short distance to a bus stop. Way to go!!!!! When I delivered the berries, I found her in the sitting room of her residence, eagerly awaiting fresh berries for her afternoon snack!

The new 2023-2024 Board Members were installed by PDG Mike Parker. Our new King Lion Terry closed out the evening with an inspiring message to start off our new year!










Eyeglass Recycling

Queen Lion Cheri called the meeting to order at 4:37 p.m.

Member Wins: Board members shared their wins for the previous week.

Standard Reports to the Board:

Secretary's Report: Lion Rick made a motion to accept the minutes from the May 5, 2023 Board Meeting as presented. Lion John seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the Board.


