The General Sessions at the Forum include four meals and at each of the meals professional speakers shared their messages to motivate, inspire and engage Lions.

All the attendees (over 1,600) have a chance to sit with either current Executive Officers, sitting International Directors, Past International Presidents, Past International Directors and the members of the Planning Committee. There were some great conversations about leadership, service and membership while we enjoyed lovely meals. Lions didn't get to sit in the same location since the general sessions were determined by the color of the name badge lanyard received at registration. This ensured that everyone had a chance to sit toward the front for one meal. All the Lions were encouraged to sit with different people at each meal to network, share information and compare ideas. Much can be learned while sharing a meal! During the three-day event there were over 60 seminars available to attend. It was difficult to decide which ones to attend and which ones to skip. One of the great things about attending the Forum is the chance to reconnect with old friends and make new ones.
