Our second presentation of Grandpa's White Cane was December 8th at Salmon Creek Elementary. The 22 students in Mr. Jeremy Stone's class were well prepared with many excellent questions. Bob Cavanaugh demonstrated Aira, a smart phone app that connects a live human on-demand to describe a blind person's surroundings, and a new feature of the Be My Eyes app called Be my AI, which, yes, uses artificial intelligence to describe what was in a single snapshot of the classroom. Then half of the stu-

dents were instructed by Bob on the use of the white cane while Lions Diane and Mike Cavanaugh introduced the other half of the students to Braille. After a bit of practice, the groups switched. The next presentations will be to 5 classes

at Truman Elementary on January 10th and 12th.

iCARE Project Trip

Nina Day, a local Lion, made a trip to Jamaica in November with 32 other doctors and volunteers from the greater Portland area. They established an eye clinic in an old community church in Mango Valley, Jamaica changing many lives for the better! Following is her report of this trip.

First, thank you so much for your support for me in this project. Because of your support, we were able to see over 300 patients a day in this clinic, for a total of 2095 patients. Our team had 48 volunteers - 13 doctors, 14 opticians, and the rest were all non-optical volunteers who learned it all. We performed over 1000 health screenings for diabetes and hypertension, and dispensed over \$200,000 worth of medications for glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy, and dry eye. We distributed 837 pairs of reading glasses, and 1,862 pairs of sunglasses - every single patient was offered sunglasses. 63 pairs of pre-fabricated NEW prescription glasses were dispensed (simple, spherical single vision prescriptions), and we measured 648 patients for their custom-made pairs that will be made in the US and dispensed by another team in February. Our ophthalmologist performed 9 PRP laser surgeries that halt the progress of diabetic retinopathy, and I even got to assist him! That was an incredible experience in itself.

I am so grateful for the support and sponsorship I received for this trip from so many of you. Thank you! This will certainly not be my last iCARE Project trip! And next time, I hope to bring some of you with me!
