King Lion Terry called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m.

Board Members Present: King Lion Terry, Phyllis Robertson, David Rich, Rick Giles, Terry Sutfin, Michele Druschel, Gay Enyeart, Dianne Cavanaugh, Mike Cavanaugh, Allen Rhyasen, and Shelly Brown.

Standard Reports to the Board:

Secretary's Report: Lion Gay made a motion to accept the minutes from the November 3, 2023 and the November 17, 2023 Board Meetings as presented. Lion Rick seconded the motion. The Board approved the motion.

Treasurer's Report: Lion Diane sent out the Treasurer's Reports prior to the meeting. She indicated that the following have been completed:

1. FVLC has been successfully filed with the Washington Office of the Secretary of State on 12/21/2023.
2. TMC fees have been confirmed to be \$9.95/mo for both Admin and Foundation accounts.
3. Quicken has been renewed to personal rather than business license.
4. Old Republic Bond has been renewed.
5. Pens have been purchased.

She also shared that the funds from the last Ilani event were erroneously deposited into the Foundation account instead of the Administrative account. Lion Rick made a motion to move the \$472.20 earned at the Ilani event from the Foundation account to the Administrative account. Lion David seconded the motion. The motion was passed by the Board. Lion Allen thanked Lion Diane for all of her work as the Treasurer!

Lion Michele shared that we donated the remaining gift cards from the Santa Store to Elizabeth to give to families who need them.

OLD BUSINESS:

Golf Tournament: Lion David shared that 3 members of the Camas Lions Club are excited to help with planning for the Golf Tournament in May. Lion Terry R. shared that IQ Credit Union is considering being a sponsor for the tournament. Lion Diane will talk to Columbia Credit Union about sponsorship. Lion Michele suggested contacting a massage school student for chair massages. David has asked that Lions Allen, Mike and Terry R. join the planning committee. There will need to be a sign with sponsors on it. Dianne will contact Dotty about getting the Golf Tournament posted on our Lions club website. Lion Dianne will be the signee on the TMC account for this event.

NEW BUSINESS:

Lions Health: Lion Allen shared information about helping to get Lions to our meetings. Lion Rick made a motion to make John Caldwell an honorary member of the Fort Vancouver Lions Club. Lion Allen seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the Board. Lion Terry will contact John to let him know about this.

Fund Raisers for 2024: Lion Allen shared information about fund raisers for this year. The date for the first Shred Event is in April, with the specific date to be decided by the committee. The second one will be in October. The frozen fruit sales will be in July.

Cakes/Cupcakes: Lion Allen shared the information about a great bakery resource with Lion Phyllis.

Membership Dues: Lion Diane brought up the subject of membership fees. Lion Gay will talk to the Licatas about their status in a Lions club in their home state. They will continue to be Associate Members. Lion Allen made a motion to make Lion Marcel an honorary member of our club. Lion Dianne seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the Board. The Board decided the Member at Large dues will be \$75. Currently, Bruce Armstrong is our only Member at Large. Lion Dianne will resend dues notices to members needing to pay their dues.

Jars for Donations: Lion Michele suggested that we put donation jars in various fast food restaurants. She will check with the corporate offices of some of them about this idea.

WSSB Heart Healthy Day: Lion Mike shared an email from WSSB about Exercise for Heart Health. The students will be participating in exercise activities throughout the day of February 14. They are requesting items for prizes for the kids.
Lion Allen suggested that we send this list to the club members to allow them to participate in this activity.

End of Year Celebration: King Lion Terry brought up the topic of the end of year celebration. He also talked about creating a committee to discuss officers for next year. The dates of May 31 through June 7 were brought up as a place to start for planning the end of the year event. A committee will be confirmed at the February Board Meeting.

Lions Contests: Lion Terry wants us to participate in the contests and awards for the District 19 Conference that Lion Bob Johnson talked about at the club meeting. Lion Dianne offered to make a tri-fold about the Santa Store.

Getting To Know Brother Marsel Tingey- A Spiritual Giant among us

He was born Jan 17th, 1928 and just celebrated his 96th birthday. Marsel was raised on a farm in Woodruff, Utah. He learned the value of work at a very young age. He was milking cows around 5 years old and doing all the other work needed on a farm.

He joined the army in 1946 at 18 years old without telling his parents. He was sent to California for Basic Training. He later received orders to Aberdeen Proving Grounds in Maryland for additional training. He was there for 4 months, then he received orders to go to San Francisco to await transportation (via ship) to Japan. On the ship to Yokohama, he became very sea sick and stayed sick for the whole voyage.

Upon completion of his military service, he spent a year at BYU, then was called on a mission to the British Mission assigned to Scotland. He spent the whole time in Scotland. In 1949, after his mission, he returned to BYU and was a member of Delta Phi Fraternity for returned missionaries and sang in their chorus. In 1952 he married Joylene Rawle. Together they had 5 children, 19 Grandchildren and 39 Great Grandchildren. He and his wife created a very close knit family, all of whom are active members of the Church.

One fun thing their family did was make hand dipped chocolates for their family, friends and neighbors at Christmas time. Brother Tingey said he cut and melted the chocolate.

Brother and Sister Tingey also served a mission in Raleigh North Carolina. Brother Tingey lost his wife two and a half years ago. They were married 69 years. After the loss of his wife, he left his homes in Seattle and Vancouver, Washington, and moved in with his daughter Sheri Tingey. They now live in Fairmeadows.

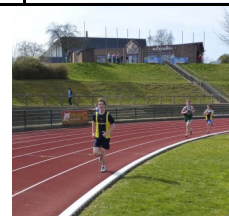

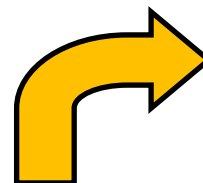

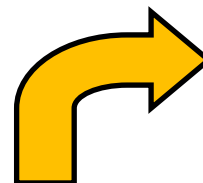
