

### **Washington Elementary Activity Options**

### 1. Breakfast with Buddies: Wednesday, March 12 7:15-8:00 AM

This is an activity in celebration of Read Across America month. Students can come with and adult (or older sibling) to enjoy some breakfast treats, read books together, do some literacy activities and listen to a read-aloud. Possible ways to help to consider: provide some of the breakfast foods (pastries, muffins, etc), volunteer at the event, help with set-up and/or clean up.

### 2. This Is Us Event: Thursday, April 17 5:00-6:30 PM

This event is a celebration of the Washington School community. It includes a sit-down dinner, a student talent show, a student performance, and displaying student work. This year's theme is Hawaiian/Pacific Island. We are hoping to have a community group of Pacific Island dancers perform as well. Possible help to consider: help set up & clean up from the event (since we basically set a table for 400 people this event requires significant set up and we start about 1:00 p.m.), volunteers to help serve the meal, providing a dessert for the meal.

### 3. Math in Motion: Thursday, May 15 2:30-4:00 PM

This event is for PreK-1st Grade students. We invite families to do math related movement activities with their student. Possible help to consider: volunteer to help during the event, help with set up and clean up.

### 4. Picnic in the Park: Friday, June 6 2:30-3:30 PM

This event takes place directly after school outside in the park at the front of the school. It is a chance for families to gather, eat snacks, get resources, and do activities in a casual relaxed atmosphere. Possible help to consider: Set-up help, volunteer to pass out snacks during the event, help provide some snacks.

Also, if club members would prefer to do a drive rather than one of the events, they are almost always looking for household cleaning products (laundry detergent, toilet papers, paper towels, dishwashing soap, Chlorox wipes, All-purpose cleaning spray, etc). They also could use sweatpants and sweatshirts (sized 5-16). Finally, if anyone has plastic shopping bags that they don't need, Elizabeth will always take them. She uses the bags when a family needs to take supplies home from the resource center or at the food pantry when families are shopping.

### Caring for Our Community: A Successful Care & Cover Drive!

These much-needed donations, collected throughout January and February, will directly benefit Share House, helping those in need stay warm and cared for. ### "A Sports Legend in his own time"

At the February 3rd meeting, Mike Cavanaugh shared his experience as a softball umpire from 2008 to 2016, primarily officiating high school girls' fast pitch games. Umpires typically work in pairs—one behind the plate and one on the bases. Mike described his gear, including a scorebook, clicker, and protective equipment like chest protectors, shin guards, and steel-toed shoes. He preferred the hockey-style face mask for added protection.

As the home plate umpire, Mike was responsible for calling balls and strikes and acting as crew chief. He explained how umpires adjust positions based on game situations, such as outfield hits or runners on base. Despite his protective gear, he recalled being hit on the hand by a ball and how umpires would compare stitch marks to gauge injuries.

Mike participated in three national tournaments and found adult slow pitch the hardest to officiate, while enjoying the enthusiasm of younger players. He once ejected a spectator for excessive heckling during a State tournament. Mike encouraged anyone interested in umpiring to join the Evergreen Fast Pitch association.

### Washington State School for the Blind Programs Update

Scott McCallum, Superintendent of the Washington State School for the Blind, highlighted key programs and initiatives at the February 21st meeting. He covered the residential and transition programs, short courses, and summer programs like the expanded core curriculum and youth employment solutions. Outreach services were emphasized for supporting public school students, and partnerships with Pacific University College of Optometry and the American Printing House for the Blind were noted. Ongoing projects include the Ogden Resource Center, assistive technology training, and upgraded science lab facilities.

### Facility Updates and Challenges

A \$60,000 grant and Patagonia's support enabled a transformation of the wood shop, with a dedicated team of volunteers. The pool deck project remains delayed but is expected to be completed by spring. Plans for a new track and blind soccer pitch face permit issues, potentially affecting the annual track meet.

### Athletics, Technology, and Student Development

The school is developing a blind soccer pitch with legislative support and modernizing its library with new technology, including refreshable Braille displays and tactile graphics devices. Scott stressed the importance of teaching students how to use these tools. A new climbing wall, funded by tuition from Oregon students, was also installed in the fitness center.

### Parent Engagement and Student Achievements

Efforts to boost parent involvement include converting Old Main's 3rd floor into parent housing and planning new student cottages. Scott also shared his experience from a recent trip where students set world records at the World Association Championships for powerlifting in Las Vegas.

### Funding and Government Impact

Scott addressed concerns about potential government shutdowns, noting that most funding comes from the state. Programs with mixed federal and state funding, like CAP, could be affected. However, he expressed confidence in the state's commitment to education, citing Governor Ferguson's statement that all state agencies except for education would take a 6% cut

### **Standard Reports to the Board:**


