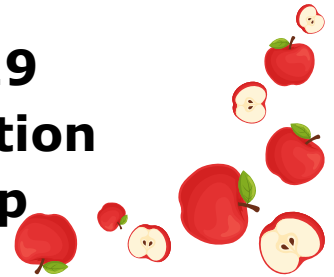

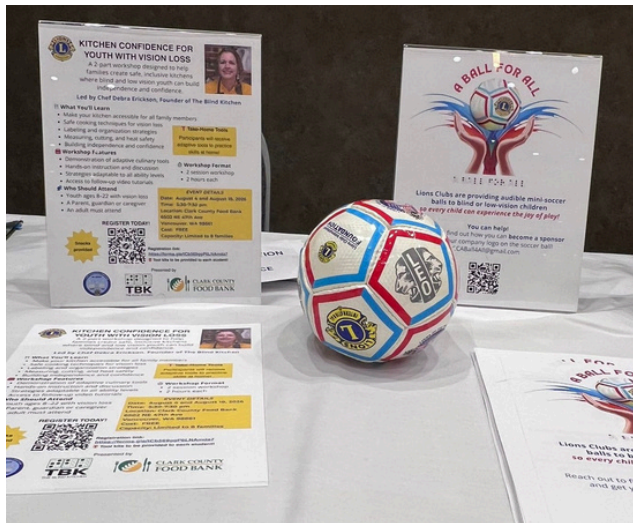
At lunch on Sunday, on behalf of FV, Lion Diane accepted the award for Club Bulletin of the year!

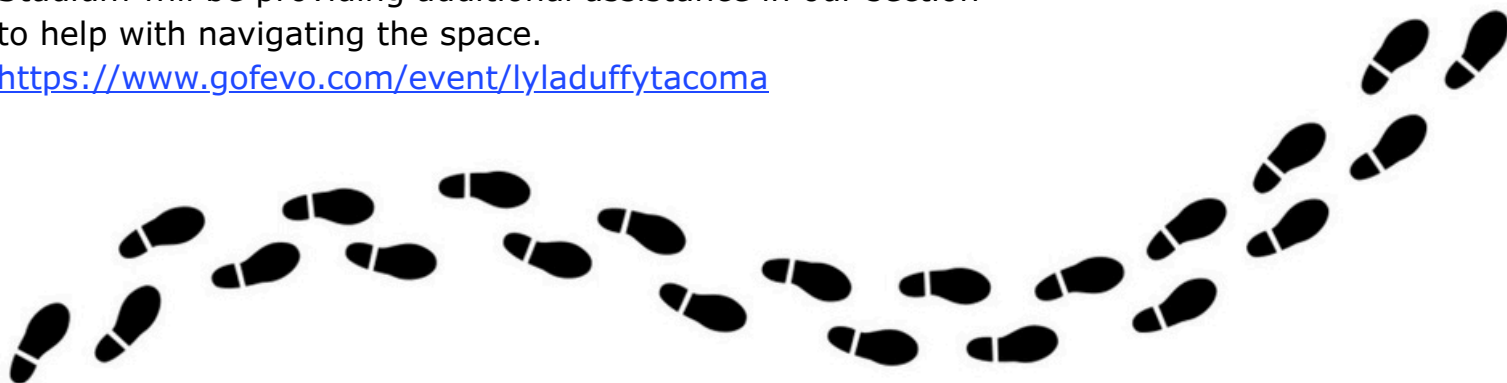
Each ticket includes a hot dog and a water, along with additional event information sent directly to your email.

### Fort Vancouver Lions Club meeting

Our guest speaker was Aaron Ochoa, Chief Ranger at the Fort Vancouver National Historic Site. Aaron presented on the significance of Fort Vancouver National Historic Site, highlighting its four key areas: Indigenous history, the Hudson's Bay Company fort, Vancouver Barracks, and aviation history. The site draws over a million visitors annually but faces staffing challenges, with park rangers reduced significantly. Volunteer support is critical and growing, with roles in interpretation, maintenance, and exhibits. Aaron emphasized community partnerships and shared upcoming events like a Nez Perce reconciliation ceremony and Memorial Day. Two pilot sessions were set: August 4 for blind youth with a parent and August 18 for low vision seniors, each serving 10 students with setup, instruction, and cleanup included. Chef Debra will draft session descriptions and tool needs; the food bank will fund the program through a nutrition grant and manage registration; Diane and Phyllis will lead marketing. A small grant will be pursued for adaptive tools, and Food Bank store shopping may be incorporated.
- Mike reported that Meka Nordquist was presented her award as the winner of the District 19N and Multiple District 19 Peace Essay contest on 4/15 at a WSSB assembly. Her essay has been forwarded to International!


